

THE PROBLEM

- ► Our affordable housing shortage is at crisis proportions.
- ► We are #1 for homelessness per capita in the nation.
- ► 48% of our people are one paycheck away from financial disaster. (3/29/16, Star-Advertiser)
- ► 25% of our people have trouble making the rent or mortgage payment. (3/29/16 Star-Advertiser)
- ▶ If you make minimum wage and live in a one bedroom apartment, you will work 125 hours per week to pay the rent. (Hawaii Business Magazine)

This problem affects ALL of us: family, friends, neighbors, church members, coworkers are impacted by this crisis, whether we realize it or not. Even our college educated children are priced out of the market. WHAT TO DO

Urge your legislators to support these funding proposals of Governor Ige:

SUPPORT the \$75 million for the Rental Housing Revolving Fund (RHRF) - which helps private-public partnerships create affordable housing, including 5,673 units built so far.

SUPPORT \$100 million for the Hawai`i
Public Housing Authority - to allow
speedy renovation of vacant units and the
development of new housing at Mayor
Wright and School Street.

SUPPORT \$25 million for the Dwelling Unit Revolving Fund to acquire, develop and construct residential, commercial and industrial properties through interim and permanent loans to developers.
