Descriptions of Proposed New Conference Advances (Green Band):

Crossroads of Life Prison Ministry

Crossroads of Life Prison Faith Community (COL) is a new United Methodist mission-church plant within a women's correctional facility in Illinois. Our charge is to create and nurture faith in Jesus Christ within incarcerated women. COL replicates the organizational structure of the UMCs outside prison walls and has an 'outside' structure to provide. Outreach programs serve the free-world while inreach serves and nurtures the incarcerated. Sound decision making, planning, executing, accountability and evaluating provide valuable tools for life inside or outside prison. Worship, membership and distinctly Wesleyan Christian Education are open to all inmates, correctional staff, and those living in the free-world community.

Descriptions of Proposed New District Advances (Blue Band – District in parentheses):

Dupage United (Aurora District)

Democracy is not merely voting, but actively engaging in the public arena to solve challenges in our communities. DuPage United has worked specifically on solving issues of unemployment, expanding STEM (science, technology, engineering, & math) and vocational training, and holding Illinois government accountable through partnerships with our sister organizations in Cook and Lake County. Our studies of unemployment and the workforce led to the development of Career Connect Metro West, which is an organization that will recruit, train and place workers into manufacturing jobs in this county. We are currently working on initiatives targeted at mental illness and public transportation.

Fox River Valley Initiative (Elgin District)

The Fox River Valley Initiative (FRVI) is a non-partisan citizens' organization of faith and civic institutions in Kane County, Illinois. We organize to build power and to do justice. Uniting people across lines of race, class, religion, political party and geography we strive to take action on key social and economic issues affecting our communities. We believe that people working together have the power to change their communities. Current issues include: expansion of mental health programs to divert persons with mental illness from jails, hospitals, and homeless shelters and into appropriate settings and affordable supportive housing.

Overflow Ministry (Chicago Southern)

Overflow Ministry is the Multi-Cultural Worship community of the Korean UMC of Flossmoor: South Suburban Chicago. We are devoted to God's redemptive work, on the move to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We "walk with" and instill hope one person, one family at a time in their time of need. Through the establishment of Jacob's Basement and Rebekah's Closet, we deliver and share donated clothing, furniture, and household goods, conveying hope and love of Christ while walking with persons and families as they find stability and security through networking information, prayer, and friendship.

Waukegan To College (Elgin)

Waukegan to College creates brighter futures for students, families and communities by preparing students to enroll in and graduate from college. W2C sends first-generation students to college who, without our intervention, may have dropped out, as one in three Waukegan High School students do. We are creating a college-going culture within an atrisk population with high poverty, low literacy, and low college attainment. With the help of volunteers, staff and the community, W2C is putting families on a path to higher education and out of poverty. Through workshops and one-on-one counseling, tutoring and mentoring, W2C helps students achieve academic success.

Rockford Work Camps (Rockford)

Put your volunteers to work! Rockford Work Camps is the best volunteer and mission site in the Northern Illinois Conference. Mission groups from around the country stay in Rockford at local United Methodist churches and do good work for nonprofits and families in need.
