Rules

Student is responsible to supply his or her own materials. All materials are accepted, including poems and essays. The size of all entries – words, photos or art – must not be smaller than 4"x6" nor larger than 11"x17". All entries must be original and created by the entrant.

- Mixed materials are accepted
- Graphic designs are accepted
- Any photographic images must be shot and developed by the entrant
- Free-hand art should be original and created by the entrant

Student should put his/her name, grade and school on the back of the artwork in addition to filling out the following form and clipping it to your artwork.

Submit your entry form and artwork by Jan. 8, 2016 to the teacher who gave you this form.

- Winners will be announced the week of Jan. 25.
- Prizes will be awarded.
- There will be a celebration for the winners.
- Selected posters will be displayed in schools and at a special installation in the Westfield Mall in Trumbull, CT.
- Winning posters may be invited for permanent installation at The Center for Family Justice. They may also be displayed on The Center for Family Justice website, www.CenterForFamilyJustice.org.
