The CTE Equation

About 12 million high school and college students are enrolled in Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs across the nation. CTE programs play an important role in preparing high school students for life after graduation. They prepare learners for the world of work by introducing them to workplace competencies and make academic content accessible to students by providing it in a hands-on context. Congress is working on a revision of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act. Appropriators give the program over \$1 billion annually. So, how are these programs doing?

Education researchers and practitioners will present data from 2 new reports by CNA Education that map CTE Career Clusters to high-growth/high wage jobs, and the importance of education and private industry stakeholders working together to use labor market data to help inform student preparation.
