ICON WORKSHOP AT SAINT LEO ABBEY

An icon is a place of prayer. In its making, in its blessing, in its use. No art experience is necessary to begin an icon, only a willingness to prayerfully listen for, and trust, the Holy Spirit under the guidance of a teacher who understands and reveres this ancient Christian tradition and its variations.



Philip Zimmerman, a well-known iconographer who teaches across the U.S. and in Canada, will teach a week-long class at Saint Leo Abbey February 15-19, his sixth at the Abbey. Each participant will write the retablo **Alma de Maria (Soul of Mary)**, pictured above, in Byzantine style, layering color instead of blending. All materials and equipment needed to complete the icon are provided: gessoed wooden board, prototype (pattern), paints, brushes, gold leaf and varnish. A gentle teacher, Phil will each morning explain what is to be accomplished that day, then demonstrate how it is to be done. He is patient and quick to lend a hand when necessary.

The workshop will be held in the Feeney Room adjoining the Abbey Guest House. There is a small kitchen for snacks, coffee and tea. Class time is Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to suppertime (5:30 for Abbey guests). Saturday morning will be devoted to varnishing and clean-up, and a celebratory lunch. Each workshop participant should leave the Abbey with a completed icon/retablo.

The fee for participants staying at the Abbey is \$660, which includes tuition, materials, six nights' lodging (Sunday through Friday) and all meals Monday through Saturday breakfast. Commuter fee is \$480 and includes tuition, materials and lunch Monday through Friday.

Workshop participants are welcome to celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours and Mass with the monks. The Abbey has a well-stocked Gift Shop, pleasant walking areas, and the University Library is nearby.
