♦ BUSINESS BURGLARIZED

The cash drawer inside the office had been taken out of a desk but it appeared that nothing but change could have been taken.

♦ WEED AND A STOLEN GUN

Two people were arrested after a traffic stop around 1:00 a.m. Wednesday on North Tennessee St. Cartersville Police stopped a car because it's brake light wasn't working. Officers saw uncapped needles inside the car and loose money. They found pills in the driver's purse, a large bag of marijuana and a .40 caliber gun that had been stolen. Arrested was the driver, Wyndi Thompson, 25, and her passenger, Eric Williams, 27, both of Cartersville. Both are charged with possession of marijuana with intent to distribute, possession of stolen property and many other charges.

- ♦ On Wednesday the GBI was requested by Woodstock Police to conduct an investigation into an officer involved shooting on Yorkshire Ln. Cherokee E911 received calls that a gun was fired. Woodstock Police were dispatched to a trouble call with screaming and a shot fired. Officers found a man with a gun and verbal commands were given. Jeremy Simpson, 22, Woodstock, didn't comply and was shot. He was transported to Kennestone Hospital for treatment and released. He is in jail charged with 3 counts of aggravated assault on a police officer. The officers are on administrative leave.
- ♦ In Middle Tennessee along Interstate 65 a new five story glass structure can be seen with used cars. The new building owned by online auto retailer Carvana is a fully automated vending machine for cars. The Arizona online based company wants to bring the concept to many more areas. They have a vending machine in Atlanta but it is much smaller.
- ♦ A man doused his wife with a flammable liquid setting her on fire in Hueytown, Alabama. Manfred McCarroll, 38, was arrested and charged with attempted murder, first degree arson and first degree domestic violence. McCarroll and his wife were both badly burned. She remains hospitalized. The incident happened during an argument.
