He began his career on the campaign trail in Texas, and then in AJC's Government and International Relations office in Washington, DC.

Rabbi Robbins and his family made aliyah to Israel in 2009, where he founded jewishlifestory.com, a personal history-writing service. He and his wife Amy have two children – Adina, 13, and Coby, 11. He is a native of Providence, RI.
