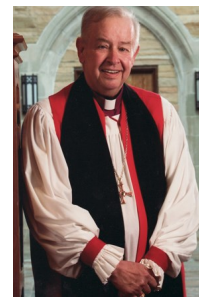
**24 The Rev. Dr. Charles D. "Ted" Hackett**

Fr. Hackett is Associate Professor of the Practice of Church Ministries, Emeritus at Emory University. He received the B.A. from Brown University, the M.Div. From Berkeley Divinity School (Yale) and the P h. D. from Emory. He was the founding Director of the Emory Episcopal Studies Program and served in this post from 1972 to 2008, and again as interim Director from 2010 to 2012. He continues to teach at Candler with regularity. He also undertook psychoanalytic training and maintained a practice of Marriage and Family Therapy from the 1970's until 2000. Fr. Hackett is the author or co-author of a number of publications having to do with the Liturgy and with the interface of psychoanalysis and theology. He is currently Priest Associate at the Church of the Holy Family in Jasper GA.



**March 2 The Rev. Dr. Don Saliers**

Dr. Don E. Saliers is Wm. R. Cannon Professor of Theology and Worship, Emeritus, Emory University. Before joining Emory University in 1974, he taught at Yale Divinity School and has taught in the summer programs at St. John's University (Collegeville, MN), Notre Dame, Sewanee, Boston College, Vancouver School of Theology, and more recently at Boston University School of Theology. For many years he directed the Sacred Music Program at Emory, and has been organist/choirmaster at Cannon Chapel for 36 years. Don served United Methodist churches in rural Ohio and the inner city of New Haven, Connecticut. He has been involved in the development of United Methodist worship resources for forty years. He has been an editor of *Worship* journal, and of *Weavings*, in addition to being an active composer, performing regularly with the Emory Chamber Players in Atlanta. He continues to teach, lecture and lead retreats.



**March 9 The Rt. Rev. Keith Whitmore**

The Right Reverend Keith B. Whitmore, Distinguished Visiting Professor of Candler's Episcopal Studies program, has been Assistant Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta since April 2008. He previously served as the fifth Bishop of the Diocese of Eau Claire in northwestern Wisconsin from 1999 to 2008. Prior to being elected as bishop, Whitmore served congregations in Wisconsin, Missouri, and Kansas. He was serving as Dean of the Cathedral in Western Kansas when elected bishop.



**March 16 The Rev. Nancy Baxter, SSAP**

The Rev. Nancy Baxter was ordained in the Diocese of Atlanta in 1981. After serving on the staff of the Cathedral of St. Philip, she was asked by Bp. Bennett Sims to create a campus ministry at Emory University. She went on to serve at Emory for 27 years, not only in ministry with students, faculty, and staff, but also as a supervisor at Candler with Episcopal seminarians. During her years at Emory, she served as chaplain at the hospitals to Episcopal patients and families from out of town, and she also developed three worshipping congregations of elders in care. In 2005, Nan founded the Society of St. Anna the Prophet (SSAP), a vowed religious community of elder women in the Episcopal Church. Inspired by the example of blessed Anna who recognized the infant Jesus when he was presented in the temple, SSAP has a prophetic ministry in its focus on the old and the young who are at the margins of both the church and society, because of poverty or disability. She continues to serve as the Superior.
