Little Leapers

Entering Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten and Grade One

Little Leapers provides a creative, nurturing and enriching environment. Campers will enjoy their summer vacation while reinforcing and building skills for a strong social and academic foundation. The program is organized into developmentally appropriate age groups. Weekly activities are themed based and will include literature, math, science, art, Spanish (June 27-August 5), and music. Although the summer is more relaxed, the students will be challenged and the skills that have been introduced during their school year will be reinforced in many fun ways.

Our day provides ample opportunities for outdoor play and fun! Daily swim instruction (June 27-August 5), provided by an experienced aquatics director and certified lifeguards, will take place in our indoor swimming pool. Students will participate in free swim during the non-instruction weeks. Swimmer to lifeguard ratios will be consistent at all times as mandated by the Department of Health guidelines.

Campers must be four years old prior to attending camp and have had previous child care experience. Campers are required to be fully toilet trained and capable of caring for bathroom and dressing needs independently.

Join us for a week or the entire summer! Children are accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis and the weeks fill up quickly.

LEAPS & Bounds Adventure Camp

Entering Grades 7-9

LEAPS & Bounds is in its sixth year of active outdoor escapades in the surrounding areas of the Capital Region. This co-ed adventure camp encourages advanced thinking, problem-solving and a life-long love of learning and adventure in the great outdoors.

Get ready for more adventure than you thought was possible! The first week will challenge campers at Adirondack Extreme Adventure Course in Bolton Landing and send them tubing down the Hudson River with Beaver Brook Outfitters. The second week is whitewater rafting with dinner included down the Hudson River with Beaver Brook Outfitters. Both weeks campers will hike and enjoy some of the most breathtaking views from the top of the Adirondack or Catskill mountains. Campers will explore some of the local parks and recreation areas such as Thacher Park, Grafton Lakes or the Pine Bush. Learning about the habitats for many plants and animals will be a focus on these days. No matter rain or shine, each day's adventure will bring a new challenge to employ outdoor skills in a fresh, fun, and imaginative way.

NOTE- It is imperative that students are able to understand and follow safety instructions. This camp requires students to have swimming skills and the ability to participate in physically challenging activities.

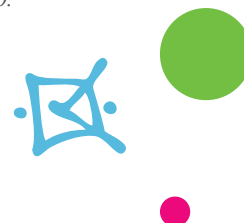

This unique and very popular camp is a two week, full-day program. Campers must register for both weeks of the two week session. 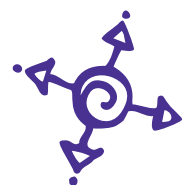

Adventures in Photography & Evening Volleyball

Adventures in Photography

Entering Grades 7-10

Join us for a week or two this summer in our Adventures in Photography camp. During week one, campers will be creating diorama compositions of miniature worlds using toys and other objects. We will explore inspiring landscape photography traveling off campus to surrounding areas of the Capital Region including the beautiful Grafton Lakes, Littles Pond, and/or Thacher Park. During week two, campers will explore architectural and urban landscapes and will be traveling off campus to downtown locations including the Empire State Plaza. Camper's imaginations will soar as they create photography that will trick the eye. Campers will appear to float, fly, and levitate during a study of levitation photography. Additionally, campers will learn useful post photo-shoot manipulations of their photographs using computer program Adobe Photoshop. At the end of each week, students will have assembled an awe-inspiring personal photography portfolio to take home. Photographs will be displayed in a group show and reception on the last day of each week.

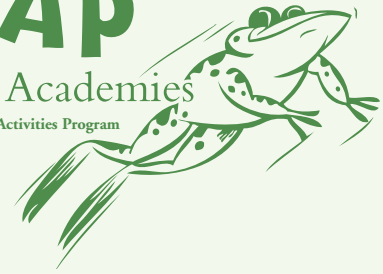
