

DID YOU KNOW?

- --Sea Isle City's new Municipal Website has been launched! Visit www.seaislecitynj.us to see our website's new design and learn how easy it is to find info about your local government.
- **--Dogs are once again permitted on Sea Isle's beaches.** Enjoy the off-season on the sand with your favorite pooch!
- **--Channel 97** offers community information throughout the day and night (on the hour and half-hour).
- --Sea Isle's new 29,000 square-foot City Hall / Public Safety Building on JFK Boulevard is ADA compliant. It also has City Council Chamber with a 134-person capacity and updated technology for visual presentations.
- --It is illegal to block the sidewalk with a vehicle when parking in a private driveway.
- --Venicean Road is now 15 mph all the way from 44th Street to the Yacht Club.
- **--Pleasure Avenue is now 15 mph for the entire length.** Also, parts of Pleasure Avenue that once were two-way are now one-way...so be on the lookout for new traffic patterns.
- --Sea Isle City offers online view and payment options for municipal property tax bills and water/sewer utility bills (visit www.seaislecitynj.us and click on the "Tax & Utility Payment Center" icon at the bottom of the homepage). You can mail-in a payment as always, or pay online through your checking account, credit card or debit card. Please Note: Online viewing is free; however a convenience charge will be applied if you pay your bills online.
- --Sea Isle City Ordinance 18-1.6 requires all trash and recycling be put in proper receptacles when placed on the curb for collection. Please remember that plastic trash bags are not considered proper receptacles except to seagulls, which have no problem cutting open plastic bags as they search for a feast.
- --Residents and property owners can register their bicycles with the Sea Isle City Police Department free of charge. For more info, phone 263-4311.
- --New Jersey State law requires motorists to stop for pedestrians in all crosswalks even if a crosswalk does not have painted stripes on the road.
- -- Sea Isle City's 2015 Drinking Water Quality Report (aka: Consumer Confidence Report) can be seen on the City's Municipal Website, www.seaislecitynj.us (under the City Departments / Public Works link). Paper copies of the report are available at Sea Isle's Welcome Center, 300 JFK Boulevard, and City Hall, 4501 Park Road.
- --The Sea Isle City Police Department offers a free service called the Citizen Call-Check Program to help ensure the safety of residents who live alone. Residents who are registered with the CCC program call the police each morning to say "I am OK" and if that call does not come to police headquarters, an officer will follow-up with a phone call or (if need be) a knock on your front door.
