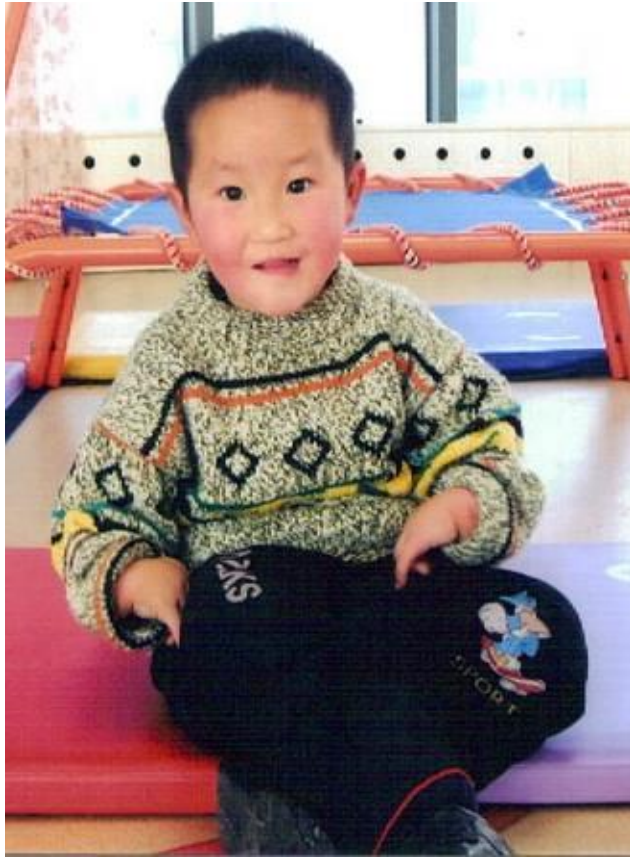

Growth Report For Lyle

Lyle, male, DOB: Dec.27 2004, was picked up on the first floor in Social Welfare Institute of City on Mar.12 2005. At that time he was wrapped in a green cotton quilt completely. A lot of search for his relatives by the public security department failed to find them. During Mar.12 2005 to Mar.29 2005 he was raised in police station of branch of public security bureau and on Mar.29 2005 he was sent to this institute to be adopted by police station. Since then he is living in this institute to this day. His name origin: "" is due to boys admitted in 2005 all have the surname of "". "" means the hope for him to be full of self confidence and vigor like the rising sun. DOB was decided according to his physical growth state and results of complete PE done by doctors on admission.

Physical examination results of the child at present: introrsus hands, absence of bilateral thumbs, absence of radius. Now he has been in the institute for 3 years and 10 months who is at the age of 4 years and 1 month. Little Lyle is extroverted, is a little afraid when meeting strangers, can greet guests when being familiar with them and also get along with guest happily. On little Lyle's round face there is a pair of bright eyes. He is a handsome boy. He is very bright, is very curious to new things. Seeing the toys he likes to play, such as cars, he looks at them to and fro, studies them carefully. Lyle also likes playing the slide. Whenever playing the slide he is very glad, won't have a rest until he is too tired to play. Presently Lyle is receiving toddlers' education. Every day teachers teach him some new knowledge. After studying for some time he learned the simple knowledge of saying children's songs, counting numerals and singing songs. He can grasp the knowledge taught by teachers soon, therefore he is often praised by teachers. Although little Lyle's actions of both hands are interfered, he can do a lot of things like other kids, e.g. pass objects, have meals with a spoon, put on clothes and shoes etc. Sometimes he can also

help caretakers do some things he can do. Little Lyle is also a positive child, lives a happy life like other kids. He likes to play games with kids, can get along well with kids. When staying with the caretaker his face always shows happy smile.

Lyle has a routine life. He gets up at 6:30 and goes to bed at 20:30. He naps for 2 hours at noon. He can eat all kinds of food. He likes meat food best, can go to sleep alone with sound sleep, has no other bad sleeping habits. He is up to date on the immunization program.
