Often referred to as "Section 7," this little used provision of the Federal Arbitration Act (9 U.S.C. §7) has acquired increasing relevance, including the creation of a model summons prepared by the New York City Bar. But there are few cases involving requests for documents and testimony pursuant to Section 7, and different courts have taken different approaches. There are also questions involving where and how to enforce a summons issued by an international arbitration tribunal and best practices. The speakers will look at these issues and others, including insights from a member of one of the committees that drafted the model summons.

As with other YAF events, the seminar will be an ideal forum for young practitioners to exchange thoughts on international arbitration, and to enrich their network in the region.
