



Massachusetts' AT Program Looking for Volunteers!!!

The Assistive Technology (AT) Act program in Massachusetts - MassMATCH - is looking for interested individuals, especially persons with disabilities who use AT to join its program Advisory Council.

All AT Act programs are required to have a consumer-majority advisory council that provides consumer-driven as well as consumer-responsive advice to the state for the planning, implementation, and evaluation of activities carried out through the grant, including setting measurable goals. In addition, the program is required to have an advisory council that is geographically representative of the State and reflect the diversity of the State with respect to race, ethnicity, types of disabilities across the age span, and users of types of services that an individual with a disability may receive.

In order to ensure that the MassMATCH Advisory council is as diverse as possible and meets the above requirements, the program is looking for individuals with disabilities who use AT, family members of such individuals or members of the public who are interested in AT to serve on our advisory council.

- The council meets once every 3 months
- All meetings are 4 hours, usually from 10:30 am to 2:30 pm
- We provide free nourishment – continental breakfast and boxed lunch
- Meetings are at a location which is accessible from anywhere in the state
- We provide transportation to and from meetings or reimburse you for your transportation
- You can participate in the meetings remotely from your home or from a nearby MRC office
- We provide reasonable accommodations such as CART, ASL, etc. to enable full participation
