About the artist: Canon for Music at Trinity Cathedral in Sacramento since 1984, David Link studied at Sacramento City College and the Royal School of Church Music in England. His piano study was with Dr. Richard Carpenter, and his organ teachers included James Lang in Sacramento and Christopher Herrick, Alan Wicks, and Peter Hurford in London. He also studied choral conducting with Paul Hillier at the University of California at Davis.

David was recognized by *Outstanding Young Men in America* in 1986, and received the Trinity Cathedral “Dean’s Award” in 1999. He founded the Cathedral Music Series and Annual Diocesan Choir Festival, and has taken the Trinity Cathedral Choir on five tours of England. His many contributions to the Cathedral and in the Diocese were recognized in January of 2001, when he was made an Honorary Canon by the Right Reverend Jerry Lamb. David recently celebrated his thirty-first year at Trinity Cathedral.

Though once referred to as “The Jimi Hendrix of the pipe organ,” he has never actually set fire to a musical instrument. He enjoys road cycling, and the summer months find him hiking and backpacking in California’s high Sierras. During his sabbatical in 2004, he climbed to the top of Mount Kilimanjaro, one of the world’s “Seven Summits.”

The Cathedral pipe organ was built in 1983 by the Reuter Organ Company, with the spectacular “Imperial Trumpet” stop added in 1990. The organ has undergone a comprehensive restoration during the last year, and the antiphonal “Processional” division was completed by Schoenstein & Sons organ builders just this month.

Today's concert is in support of the **NorCal AIDS Cycle 2016**, a 300 mile/four day bike ride to benefit agencies serving those in the Sacramento area with HIV/AIDS. This is David's fifth year participating in NCAC. For those who wish to make a more substantial donation to NCAC, the opportunity will be available following the concert this afternoon!

Facts about HIV/AIDS

- Approximately 35 million people worldwide have HIV/AIDS
- Sub-Saharan Africa makes up an estimated 28 million of those infections
- 3.34 million of those infected are children
- In the United States there are approximately 1.1 million people with HIV/AIDS
- There is a new infection in the United States approximately every 9 minutes
- There are approximately 5,000 people in the Sacramento area diagnosed with HIV/AIDS
- Black and Hispanic men and women are dis-proportionally affected
- Those in poverty are four times more likely to be infected
- 20% of those who are infected don't know it
- As funding for treatment has decreased in the last few years, infections have increased
