

- California's racial/ethnic composition
 - 13.2% Asian (5 million)
 - 0.4% is NHPI (138,000)
- 20 distinct ethnic groups within these two racial groups.
- Filipino, Chinese, and Vietnamese are the largest Asian American groups.
- Native Hawaiians, Samoan, and Guamanian or Chamorro are the largest NHPI groups.
- All of these ethnic groups are growing at rates that far outpace the statewide growth rate.





2012-13 A-G Completion Rates




AANHPI Undergraduate Enrollment in CA

Falll 2013 Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander Undergraduate Enrollment in California







CA Community Colleges: "Unprepared" status


Percent of entering 2007-08 cohort deemed "unprepared" for collegelevel work


Six-Year Completion Rates for "Unprepared" 2007-08 cohort





CSU: First-time Freshman Enrollment


Fall 2013 First-Time Freshmen (CA Residents) Enrollees



Percent who need remediation in any subject Fall 2013 New Regularly Admitted First-Time Freshmen




CSU: Graduation Rates






