

The Adele Social Justice Project (ASJP) is currently looking for new members to join its core team! ASJP is the project team of the Marianist Social Justice Collaborative whose mission statement is “to engaging young adults in the Marianist charism and social justice efforts.” It is a project by young adults in their 20s and 30s for young adults. Starting in 2005, ASJP was created in response to the growing need for young adults to connect with each other and maintain their passion for faith and justice.

Joining the core team is an excellent way to connect with young adults across the country and to actively serve the Marianist Family as part of a lively and growing ministry. Core team members are asked to participate in a monthly conference call, a few hours of independent and/or group work per month, and an annual weekend-long meeting. The work of an ASJP core team member can include any number of activities from outreach, networking, and event planning to fundraising, to spiritual formation. All activities will be done as a collaborative effort with other core team members.
