DOVETALE (104018) Author: Swartz, Ted; Eshleman, Lee; De Sanctis, Ingrid. How the First Christmas Finally Came Together. Comedy/theater duo Ted & Lee, along with playwright Ingrid De Sanctis, authored the DoveTale script and portray all 11 characters in it. The play finds gentle humor as Mary, Joseph, and Gabriel stumble through the gritty realities of God becoming human. Other minor characters appear as well: a couple of earthy shepherds, a verbose innkeeper, chatty Elizabeth and her mute husband Zechariah, and a wedding photographer. Taped in front of a live audience. Captions available in both English and Spanish. 83 Minutes.

DRIVE THRU HISTORY: BETHLEHEM TO CAESAREA (104069) Author: Stotts, Dave. Volume 3: Miracles, Messiah, and the Roman Empire. Join host Dave Stotts as he speeds through the ancient world of the Bible. MIRACLE OF CHRISTMAS: A SANDSTORY PRESENTATION (113053) Author: Castillo, Joe. In this dynamic visual experience with a music soundtrack, Joe Castillo tells the Christmas story in a series of scenes created by manipulating black sand on a colored lightboard. 19 Minutes.

MR. KRUEGER'S CHRISTMAS (113028) The story of a lonely man whose Christmas fantasies come true. As he decorates his Christmas tree, Mr. Krueger (played by Jimmy Stewart) dreams about directing the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. He invites some real carolers inside for warmth and refreshment. After they leave, his fantasies continue and he finds himself among the now living biblical figures of his creche. In a moving monologue, he thanks Christ for being with him as a friend and comforter. The carolers return and invite him to join him in singing and sharing Christmas dinner (26 min.). Includes guide. Additional DVD segments include: The Restoration (about Joseph Smith); The Nativity (5 min.); and Carols of Christmas (25 min.). 26 Minutes.

NATIVITY: THE ART AND SPIRIT OF THE CRECHE (114017) The history, art, and spirituality of the nativity scene have been embraced by cultures around the world. In this DVD, theologians and collectors explain the history of the creche and discuss the individual elements within it. Illustrated with a variety of international creches housed at the Mepkin Abbey in South Carolina. CLOSED CAPTIONED. 27 Minutes.

O CHRISTMAS TREE: A CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTMAS TREE (115020) This documentary looks at various aspects of the Christmas tree: it's history, how they are grown, decorations, etc. 55 Minutes.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE SPIRITUAL EXPLORER (118010) Three meditations for use by individuals or groups: 1) **With You Always**: Reflective images from scripture and our world bring to life the song 'Mary Did You Know' (6 min.); 2) **How Beautiful**: The song 'How Beautiful' is paired with scriptural and modern images in this reflective piece (6 min.); 3) **Mystic Moments**: A quote from Thomas Merton sets the stage for a virtual walk through the forest on a beautiful day in early fall (16 min.). Leader's guide includes ideas for use with the two music segments.

SAVING JESUS (119050) A 12-Session Small Group DVD-Based Exploration of Jesus Christ for the Third Millennium. Ever feel like Jesus has been kidnapped by the Christian Right? This study, featuring a variety of religious voices (some controversial), discusses the following topics: 1) Jesus through the ages and across cultures (25 min.); 2) Who was Jesus? (19 min.); 3) What can we know about Jesus (and how) (21 min.); 4) **The world into which Jesus was born** (19 min.); 5) **Jesus' birth: incarnation** (21 min.); 6) Teachings of Jesus: wisdom tradition (24 min.); 7) Jesus' program: the Kingdom of God (17 min.); 8) Jesus' ministry of compassion (20 min.); 9) Killing Jesus, part one: who killed Jesus? (19 min.); 10) Killing Jesus, part two: the atonement (21 min.); 11) The resurrection of Christ (22 min.); 12) Why Jesus is worth saving (23 min.). Also includes a 9-minute overview segment. Contributors include Marcus Borg, John Dominic Crossan, Matthew Fox, Amy-Jill Levine, James Forbes, John Shelby Spong, Helen Prejean, and others. The basic format for each weekly 60 to 90 minute session includes conversation around the readings, a 20-minute (approx.) DVD segment, and guided discussion. Kit includes two DVDs, a CD-ROM with print material, and a binder of materials printed from the CD-ROM.

STORY OF ADVENT: Speed Sketch Bible Stories (119135) This DVD contains four Bible stories told in 'speed sketch' style which are appropriate for use with all ages. Each story is told in two versions: 1) an easy-to-understand narrated paraphrase; 2) narrated directly from the NIV 1984 translation of the Bible. Likewise, each story in both forms is available with either English or Spanish audio. TRUE CHRISTMAS STORY, THAT THE WORLD MAY KNOW (120001) Author: Vander Laan, Ray. **This DVD contrasts Herod the Great and the ruins of the Herodian and other building programs Herod built in Israel with Jesus, the King of the Universe, the Messiah born a few miles from the Herodian (Herod's palace) in Bethlehem in humble circumstances** (17 min). Also includes the segment 'Living Water,' the story of En Gedi and the significance of living water to King David and to us (23 min). Other bonus materials (under 5 min. each) include: Hebrew Thinking; Illustration Gallery; Video Trailers: True Christmas Story, True Easter Story, That the World May Know. CLOSED CAPTIONED.

VISION OF SIMPLER LIVING (122019) This DVD includes three separate programs: "Break Forth Into Joy" (15 min. with three additional 10 min. segments) -- encourages persons to adopt simpler lifestyles which reflect biblical teachings on wealth and poverty. "The Celebration Revolution of Alexander Scrooge" (17 min.) -- In this story, told with cartoon drawings, visits from three spirits teach Alexander (great-great-grandson of Ebenezer) the value of celebrating all holidays and special days in a simpler and more meaningful way. "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" (18 min.) -- encourages people to make Christmas celebrations less consumer-oriented and more meaningful. Includes guide.

UNPLUG THE CHRISTMAS MACHINE: WORKSHOP LEADER'S GUIDE (721011) Author: Robinson, Jo and Staeheli, Jean Coppock. Help Your Group Create a Joyful, Stress-Free Holiday. Designed for a four-hour workshop, the materials can be adapted for a four-week study for adults. The kit includes notes for the leader, reproducible participant pages, and an audio CD.

VINTAGE CHRISTMAS: WOMEN'S HOLIDAY EVENT KIT (722007) Plans for a one-session event in which women share Christmas traditions and memories and are challenged to keep Christ at the center of everything they do during the busy holiday season. Designed as a 25-day devotional guide, this book includes a short devotion each day for both children and adults. Suggestions for making an Advent Jesse Tree with ornaments is included.

BIRTH OF THE MESSIAH (812107) Author: Brown, Raymond. A Commentary on the Infancy Narratives in Matthew and Luke This scholarly book covers every aspect of the Nativity story. Includes index.

CAROLS OF CHRISTMAS: A Celebration of the Surprising Stories Behind Your Favorite Holiday Songs (815180) Andrew Gant, former director of Her Majesty's Chapel Royal in Great Britain, discusses the origins of 21 beloved carols: 1) O Come, O Come Emmanuel; 2) O, Christmas Tree; 3) The Holly and the Ivy; 4) I Saw Three Ships; 5) O Little Town of Bethlehem; 6) Good Christian Men, Rejoice; 7) O Come, All Ye Faithful; 8) While Shepherds Watched; 9) O Holy Night; 10) Ding dong! FIRST CHRISTMAS (807226) Author: Borg, Marcus & Crossan, John Dominic. What the Gospels Really Teach about Jesus's Birth. The authors propose 1) to exposit the birth stories and their meanings in their first-century context, and 2) to treat their meanings for Christian understanding and commitment today.

FIRST CHRISTMAS: WHAT REALLY HAPPENED? (814212) Author: Richards, H. J.. Readings for the four weeks of Advent are arranged by theme: waiting, mystery, redemption, and incarnation. These are followed by devotions for the twelve days of Christmas, which stretch from Christmas Day until January 5. The book also includes a final reflection for January 6, the feast of Epiphany. Includes Scripture index.

GOOD TIDINGS OF GREAT JOY (823999) Author: Barclay, William. The Birth of Jesus the Messiah. Reflections on the birth of Jesus Christ to enrich the Advent and Christmas season and bring the good tidings of the Savior to a new generation.

GROUP'S BODY-BUILDING GUIDE TO COMMUNITY (807057) Author: McMahan, Candace, editor. Strengthening Relationships in Your Church. This book provides 15 practical ways to encourage lasting friendships in your church. Build community among: men, through a new take on meal ministry, through racial reconciliation, at annual meetings, during the 12 days of Christmas, among children and adults, before and after worship, through long-term share groups, through membership retreats, with college students, through date nights, among women, among mothers of young children, through 6-week spiritual adventures, and with shut-ins. PREACHING THE INCARNATION (810042) Author: Stevenson, Peter and Wright, Stephen. The authors discuss 12 important Bible passages connected with the doctrine of incarnation. Each chapter includes a complete sermon on the passage followed by discussion.
