David Barboza In 2001, when volunteering as a Ring Steward, David recognized the process and challenges that livestock judging presented and decided to attend the International Alpaca Judging School (IAJS). After returning from Peru he entered the AOBA (now AOA) Judges Training program and completed his Certification from both IAJS and AOBA as a Halter, Fleece and Performance Judge. He judged his first show in 2006 and has since judged over 60 shows in the US and Canada. David served a 3 year term on the AOBA board, serving as Secretary and President. Promoting youth involvement in Alpacas is a passion and he has been instrumental in developing Alpaca Youth Judging contests throughout the US. To expand his knowledge of livestock, David enrolled in Graduate Studies at Colorado State University.
