

An Easter View from 40th & Wilson

T appy Easter! THANK YOU for coming to Mass in celebration of this great ongoing mystery: Jesus Christ dying to self, risen with God-showing us the way as his disciples.

I want to share some quotes I encountered recently. I hope they will prompt you to consider why the practice of the Roman Catholic faith is vital to us as individuals and for our wounded world.

The first one is from Trisha Yearwood. She's the country singer and author who played the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Fox musical, The Passion. (Yearwood also happens to be the wife of Garth Brooks.)

Parade magazine asked her why she did The Passion. Her answer:

"What's interesting to me is whether you were raised in the church and you know the story; whether you're Christian or not, the message is important: a story of suffering, sacrifice, love and forgiveness, hope and resurrection."

The other quotes were shared by Douglas Kindschi, director of the Kaufman Interfaith Institute at Grand Valley State University. In a recent Grand Rapids Press article, Kindschi shared his excitement about the winner of the Templeton Price for Progress in Spiritual Understanding. The 46th annual recipient is Rabbi Jonathan Sacks, the former Chief Rabbi of Great Britain.

Sacks has written several influen-

tial books, including "Not in God's Name: Confronting Religious Violence," published last fall.

"Sacks believes that the assumption that secularization and modern science will solve our problems is a gross over-simplification," Kindschi explains. "Not only does it fail to take account of the persistence of faith, it is helpless in addressing the human condition."

Then he quotes Sacks:

"None of the great institutions of the modern age-science, technology, the market economy or the liberal democratic state-offers a compelling answer of the three great questions every reflective human being will ask at some stage in life: Who am I? Why am I here? How then shall I live?

"These belong to a different universe of discourse to that charted by science."

Sacks makes the following distinction:

"Science takes things apart to see how they work. Religion puts things together to see what they mean. We will always inhabit a world of the spirit that searches not just for explanation but also for meaning."

St. Pius X Parish exists so that we do not just view Jesus Christ from a distance, or in a musical or on certain days of the year. Following Jesus is a lifelong endeavor that takes us into eternity. That's Easter.

Building Improvement Feasibility study to begin

Our 5-year Pastoral Plan is intended to help us address obstacles that keep us from welcoming new parishioners, engaging existing parishioners, and stimulating the interest and involvement of youth.

Some of these obstacles lie in the area of our facilities. A Campus and Facilities Master Plan has been developed. The next step is a Feasibility Study to determine parishioners' overall reaction and level of support for the proposed plan. Feedback will be sought by either a personal confidential interview or by completing a survey. Next month, you will either receive a survey to complete or be invited to meet with a member of The Breton Group, a development consulting firm, for a personal interview. All parishioner feedback is confidential and only viewed by The Breton Group who will provide a summarized final report of all feedback regarding the proposed plan. PLEASE take this opportunity very seriously so parish leadership can continue making wise decisions. Please pray that God's will be done at St. Pius. X.

It helps us develop a unique and personal relationship with him. We watch Jesus's face. We listen to the way he speaks. We notice how people respond to



him. These imaginative details bring us to know Jesus as more than a name or a historical figure in a book. He is a living person. We say what the villagers in John's Gospel told the Samaritan woman: "We have come to know him ourselves, and not just from your report." (David Fleming ignatianspirituality.com).
