

How much?

If you're like me, when you see something you really admire at a store, the first thing you do is look at the price tag.

Depending on the amount, you might pause with glee and wonder "can I?" I usually drop it and move on.

We Americans are rather preoccupied with how much things cost.
Why else do we keep an ongoing conversation about the price of gas, which is even more unpredictable than Michigan weather?

One topic people are more reluctant to discuss is how much we owe the Church and to charities.

Today's first reading puts a dollar value on being a believer: one-tenth. That's what Abram gave the priest to express his gratitude to God after a successful battle.

For both Jews and Christians, "the tenth" in Genesis 13:20 is known as the tithe. With trust and in gratitude, we make an offering to God of onetenth of our income. The rule of thumb for Catholics is that five percent goes to the parish, 1 percent to the diocese through the <u>Catholic Services Appeal</u> and the remaining four percent to other charities.

This tenth can be understood as a sacrifice: "I give up something of value because I believe it will accomplish something of even more value—for the world and for my soul." We unite our sacrifice with Christ's sacrifice on the cross.

[Full disclosure: When I did my taxes for 2015, I discovered that I had gave 8.7% rather than 10. I am making up for it in 2016.]

One complaint about priests is that we "always talk about money." But pastors have to talk about money because unlike nearly everything else we encounter, there is no fee schedule or price tag affixed to the work we do in the name of Jesus Christ.

At St. Pius X, this is especially true because we operate as a "stewardship parish." This means we have no fees

for funerals or weddings, no baskets out for donuts, no registration fees for religious education. We trust our members are intentional about supporting their parish.

Budget Time — With the fiscal year ending July 1, the parish staff is finalizing the operational budget for 2016-17. Much of this work is done by Marilyn Beckwith, business manager.

The Finance Council gives us the spending parameters. For the coming year, we are projecting \$975,000 in Sunday offertory collections—the same as for the current fiscal year. With the possibility of a capital campaign for building improvements on the horizon, finance council members do not feel we can expect increased collections, even as our costs increase.

So every gift is precious — not just treasure but the talents freely shared by frequently called "volunteers." For those whose efforts flow from baptism, a better name is "disciples."

It's humbling to consider that everything we do as a parish comes from the free-will offering of our members.

Incidentally, did you know that one -half of our Sunday offerings come from 100 households? These are not necessarily the wealthiest households, rather they are those, who like Abram, recognize how much they are blessed and want to make a return.

Whether you already tithe, or like me need to step up again, thank you for supporting St. Pius X Parish.



Saint of the Week

Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary ~ Feast May 31

This feast commemorates the three-month visit of Mary with her elderly cousin Elizabeth during Mary's pregnancy with Jesus and Elizabeth's with John the Baptist. The story appears in the first chapter of Luke's Gospel. It recounts Elizabeth's Spirit-filled greeting, acknowledging Mary as "the mother of my Lord," and Mary's beautiful response, the Magnificat, which begins, "My soul



proclaims the greatness of the Lord." Introduced by the Franciscans in 1263, the feast became universal in the 16th century. The cousins' visit has been depicted by many artists over the centuries. An especially tender "Visitation," painted by Mariotto Albertinelli and considered his masterpiece, is on display at the Uffizi in Florence, Italy.

PRAYER POST: Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

What is the history of Eucharistic Adoration? The practice of Eucharistic Adoration spread through Europe and culminated in the establishment of the Feast of Corpus Christi—Latin for "the Body of Christ"—in 1264.

The feast itself, celebrated this weekend, helped spread the devotion.

It was not until after the Council of Trent, however, that perpetual adoration began to develop on a worldwide scale. During the Protestant Reformation, church lootings were common, as were desecrations of the Blessed Sacrament. Faithful

Catholics made reparation to God by keeping a loving vigil before Him, around the clock. Perpetual adoration became a symbol of constancy in a volatile age.

Throughout Europe and eventually America, new religious orders arose centered on uninterrupted Eucharistic adoration. In 1907, the Catholic Encyclopedia could state that such orders were too numerous to list. In the years following the Second Vatican Council, the devotion began to wane, only to rise again in popularity with the encouragement of Pope John Paul II. St. Pius X Parish offers Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday following the 8:30am Mass until 7pm.
