

SOME THOUGHTS ON PRAYER

One thing I really like about being a priest is that I am "paid to pray."

I didn't make up that phrase—
"paid to pray." I heard it in the seminary from a priest who was trying to
emphasize the importance of priests
having a disciplined prayer life.

At our Lord's Day Masses this summer, we are journeying with Jesus toward Jerusalem in Luke's gospel. It's a stressful, chaotic trip. Can you relate?

Somehow, Jesus remains focused through it all. His disciples notice. And thus we have Jesus teaching his disciples The Lord's Prayer in today's gospel.

Sometimes in the morning when I am praying, I feel a bit of sadness for the people I know who choose not to pray; who do not choose the "better part," as Jesus said in last week's Gospel passage. Do they realize what they are missing?

As we did with our Lenten theme a few years ago, I encourage you to "Find your holy place." That is, dedicate a location in your home where you can sit down, let all your anxieties flow out like a bathtub drain, and then lift up your heart to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

I must do this first thing in the morning, equipped with a cup of coffee, the Liturgy of the Hours, some spiritual reading and silence. Have a designated span of time; setting a timer if necessary.

As a single guy who lives in a big house, I know this is much easier for me to arrange than for parents and people who live in crowded houses. You will need to adapt to fit your lifestyle; but don't give up.

I wonder if my desire to pray stems from the following poem which hung in our house as a child. Fr. Ronald Rolheiser quotes it in his new book, "Sacred Fire: A Vision for a Deeper Human and Christian Maturity," which I highly recommend.

Sometimes, it feels like real work to pray. In the end, we are all "paid to pray" through the healing grace of a relationship with God.

THE DIFFERENCE

I got up early one morning and rushed right into the day; I had so much to accomplish, I didn't have time to pray.

Problems just tumbled about me and grew heavier with each task;

Why doesn't God help me, I wondered; He answered, "You didn't ask.""

I wanted to see joy and beauty, but the day toiled on, gray and bleak;

I wondered why God didn't show me— He said, "But you didn't seek."

I tried to come into God's presence; I used all my keys at the lock:

God gently and lovingly chided, "My child, you didn't knock."

I woke up early this morning and paused before entering the day; I had so much to accomplish that I had to take time to pray.
