

**Assorted & Important PARISH NEWS**

BUILDING UPDATE — Members of the parish Campus and Facilities Master Planning Committee had a three-hour meeting last Tuesday to discuss how to best proceed with addressing our facility needs.

You may recall that the conceptual plans on display in the vestibule total \$3.5 million. A feasibility study indicates a capital campaign would raise \$2-2.5 million—perhaps up to \$3 million if parishioners believe strongly in the project. With \$500,000 from savings, that leaves us with a gap of \$500,000 to \$1 million.

There's great support for a new youth room, and it's a no-brainer that we must resurface our parking lots and replace aging boilers.

What we're struggling with is the proposed Gathering Area outside the church. Some believe this is a "need." Others deem it a "want."

Most parishioners are here just once a week to celebrate the Lord's Day (if that often). The Gathering Area would offer space for people to congregate and be drawn more deeply in the life of the parish before and after Mass. Such a space would appease those who want to pray before Mass but are disturbed by others who socialize in church.

Just as significantly, this area would provide a hub between the three wings of our building, which can feel like a sprawling maze.

I think you can tell I dream of a Gathering Area for St. Pius X! But I certainly understand the position of those who say "yes, that would be nice, but we can't afford it."

The consensus of the committee is to ask the architect to explore other configurations that would address concerns raised by the feasibility study and trim \$500,000 from the package.

From the feasibility study, the committee also learned that parishioners want to be certain that other options have been explored—such as renovating existing space. Many people

observe that we have many empty rooms on campus. That's true—except during peak times when Religious Education or youth ministry is in session. With people's schedules being as busy as they are, it's very difficult to match up our spaces with people's schedules.

On Tuesday, the committee also discussed the feasibility of erecting a low-cost stand-alone building to serve as a youth center. While this is an appealing solution, the consensus is that keeping our facility tied together would be more practical and affordable in the long run.

As I've said before: please stay tuned. And please, keep praying.

STAFF UPDATE — As you may know, we have two openings on our parish staff. My hope is to introduce next week our new Pastoral Associate for Pastoral Care, Outreach and Christian Initiation. Interviews for a new Coordinator of Youth Ministry are underway. Fortunately, Merry Hass is continuing in this role until her replacement is on board.

CRUCIFIED and RISEN — Our parish has long had the custom of displaying an image of the Risen Christ during the Easter Season, and a traditional crucifix during other times of the year. But not this summer. The crucifix has been sent away for refinishing, along with a carved statue of the Sacred Heart that stood in the chapel.

Carved in Italy, I think the crucifix was first placed in the sanctuary of the original church when it was remodeled in 1978. Like most of us, Jesus' corpus had begun to fade and develop age spots over the past 30 years. The cost of the \$2,000 restoration is coming from the church memorials fund. A new Italian carved corpus would be \$5,500.

Nuptial Blessing by Pope Francis | Elizabeth Post

It was a chilly morning for the end of May in Rome. While I am normally really bothered by the cold, this morning I was running on the adrenaline of what this day would bring.

My husband, Mike, and I stood outside of St. Peter's Square in Vatican City at 7am, waiting for the gates to open. We were with two friends and hundreds of others. This was something I had dreamed about since the day I knew it was a possibility. Not only were we going to a Papal Audience, but we were dressed in our wedding attire and actually going to meet and receive a blessing from the Pope himself! I remember attending other papal audiences, one with Pope Benedict and one with Pope Francis, and seeing brides and grooms walking around St. Peter's Square. Wondering what that was about, I discovered that within your first year of marriage, you can petition Rome to attend a papal audience and receive a blessing from the Pope. This was something, God-willing, I was going to do!

The trip was planned in January, tickets purchased, arrangements made and four months later, we were here! We waited in the line for about an hour until the gates opened. Unsure of where we were supposed to go, some volunteers ushered us to the front onto a stage. We were in the section with about 50 other newly married couples from around the globe. The view of the square was incredible as it filled with thousands of pilgrims.

The audience began at 10am as Pope Francis made his way through the crowd, waving and greeting people. We actually could not see much

of what was going on in the square but once he arrived on stage, we had a nice profile view of the Pope. We were about 30yds away. His message reminded us to "pray always and don't lose heart". The audience was

relatively short and completed by 11am. Unsure of what was going to happen next, a handful of volunteers moved their way through the bridal section and removed a few of the barriers. We were one of the first ten couples escorted onto the main stage area. Mike and I secured a space right behind the barrier.

Watching the Pope, it was obvious he was intently focusing on whoever he was speaking with at any given moment. He took his time and did his best to be present to each individual. Finally, he was only a few feet from us. I could hardly contain my excitement, and nerves! What was I going to say to him? I had been running through various things I wanted to say for days but now I was really about to speak to the Pope! He moved in closer, surrounded by his body guards and photographers. He shook Mike's hand first. I'm not sure if Pope Francis spoke to Mike at all or just exchanged a warm greeting and handshake. As he moved on to shake my hand he looked very intently into my eyes. He had soft gentle hands and really didn't need to speak. I mustered up my courage and began to talk to him in Spanish. I told him how wonderful it was to meet him and I introduced Mike and I. He nodded warmly. Then I asked if he would be so kind as to bless us and I mentioned that I was now pregnant and hoping he would bless our unborn child. Pope Francis immediately got excited and was full of smiles! He placed his hand on my stomach and I placed my hands on top of his. He prayed a blessing over Mike and I and our child. Time stood still. It seemed like we were in that moment for hours when it was likely about two minutes. Trying to hold back the tears, we thanked him, said goodbye and he moved on to the next couple. Mike and I stumbled away, overcome with emotion. We had just not only met the Pope but received a nuptial blessing and blessing for our unborn child!! In a daze, we found our friends and proceeded to walk through the Jubilee Year of Mercy Doors.

We remained in our wedding attire the rest of the day, rejoicing in the blessing received from the Pope and rejoicing in the blessings that God was giving us. I have no idea who this little child of ours will be, but it is pretty incredible that he or she will enter the world already having met and been touched by our Holy Father!

PRAYER POST: Lectio Divina ~ Sacred Reading

Lectio Divina, while it may sound intimidating, is a flexible and easy way to pray with Holy Scripture. Not to be confused with a bible study, this form of prayer is not done to gain information but using the texts to aide in your contact with God. It can be prayed individually or in a group. This method of prayer goes back to the early monastic tradition. Since there were not bibles for everyone nor did everyone know how to read, monks gathered in a chapel to hear a member of the community reading from the scripture. In this exercise, they were taught and encouraged to listen with their hearts because it was the Word of God that they were hearing. Some people who regularly engage in this method of prayer choose the epistle or the Gospel for the Mass of the day as suggested by the Catholic Church.
