

Living in Mercy



FOR HEALING, ANOINTED: FOR MISSION

n Monday evening, about 50 young parishioners will be anointed with oil on their foreheads as they receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Cathedral of St. Andrew.

Then on Friday, parishioners who are suffering from illness or aging will be anointed on their foreheads during the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at a special 10am Mass here at St. Pius X.

Isn't it fascinating how the ritual is the same for both sacraments?

While the holy oils and the purposes for the sacraments of Confirmation and the Anointing of the Sick are very different, both express the core reality of our identity as Catholic-Christians:

chosen by Christ and open to the will of the Father as disciples.

I am tempted to write scads more about this wonderful reality of our faith, but I have not the space nor the time. Instead, I want to encourage those who'd benefit from the Anointing of the Sick to please avail themselves of this sacrament. If you can't make it to Mass on Friday, seek me out (or find another priest.)

"When the sacrament...is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness," explains the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults. "But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age."

Here's what's also significant about the sacrament of the sick, which is also intended for the faithful anticipating surgery or battling mental illness: "The Holy Spirit renews our faith in God and helps us withstand the temptations of the Evil One to be discouraged and despairing in the face of suffering and death." the catechism states.

Ascension Sunday — Our 50-day celebration of Easter is nearing its end.

A signal for that is next Sunday's focus on the Ascension of the Lord. Remember, after Jesus rose from the dead and appeared multiple times to his disciples, another wondrous miracle happened: "he was lifted up, and a cloud took them from his sight. (Acts 1:-11).

Why? You'll find the answer in one of the prayers we will pray at Mass next Sunday:

"He ascended, not to distance himself from our lowly state, but that we, his members, might be confident of following where he, our Head and Founder, has gone before."

This concept of us being united with God in heaven can never be fully understood with our minds. Only the heart can grasp it. That's why we call it the Paschal Mystery.

Paulist Father Chuck Cunniff, CSP will have the pleasure of celebrating the Ascension of the Lord at St. Pius X. I will be in Bay City celebrating my father's 80th birthday. Then I will take part in my annual priest retreat until Sunday, May 15 — Pentecost.

We smell the dust kicked up by the passersby. We feel the itchy clothing we're wearing, the sweat rolling down our brow, a rumble of hunger. We see the desperation in the blind man's face and hear the wail of hope in his words. We note the irritation of the disciples. Above all we watch Jesus—the way he walks, his gestures, the words


