

CAMPUS and FACILITIES MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The team from Progressive AE will be here Monday through Wednesday to finalize the master plan with input from the committee charged with this project.

Together, we will engage in what's known as a **charette**, which is defined as "an intense period of design or planning activity."

At St. Pius X, this will entail the architects sketching out possible building configurations based on the information they have gathered from various sources, including interviews and questionnaires, last year's planning process, and the Oct. 4 Town Hall Workshop.

For three evenings this week, members of the Campus and Facilities Master Plan Committee will meet with the architects from Progressive.

The hope is that each day the plans will become more

refined in addressing our need to improve our facilities to better serve our parish, in particular our youth and the experience of coming together on Sundays. The process will entail a bit of dreaming about what could be, while also being realistic about what parishioners will support.

ore than 90 people attended the Parish Town Hall Workshop last Sunday. I was very impressed by this process and the participants.

We worked in groups of six to eight people. Using photographs and words provided by Progressive, each group created a collage that depicts what they consider our parish's aspirations. Then the difficult part began — prioritizing these aspirations.

There was far too much information generated at the sessions to share here. Suffice it to say that Sunday's workshop showed the fruitfulness of the work done in our past planning activities. Once again, participants expressed a strong desire for us to be a welcoming community, rooted in our Roman Catholic tradition, reaching out in service — but also having fun.

One of the participants noted that all the planning meetings we've had the past few years have felt a bit like being in an incubator. Please join me in praying that something will hatch soon.



My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

very year we remember in a special way our Baptismal call to mission as we celebrate **World Mission Sunday**, this year on **October 18**.
