

The Gospel today is very clear! Everyone is asking John the Baptist: "What should we do?" (Luke 3:10). That is the perfect question as we anticipate the second coming of Christ. Let us be found doing the Corporal Works of Mercy: feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick, visiting the prisoners, burying the dead, and giving alms to the poor.

- Who needs my second coat or blanket or hoots?
- Who needs a tithe of my food budget, of my time, of my conversation?
- Who needs to hear Good News? How can I proclaim it by word and by deed?

Prepare for next week: Read and reflect on the Fourth Sunday of Advent (beginning on p. 49 in "Living Liturgy" missal).

o all who have adorned their yards with Christmas cheer, I say: Thank you! The lights help alleviate the gloom of these short, cloudy, foggy days and early nights.

I'm having a rough time getting in the holiday spirit, due to the unseasonably warm weather and lack of snow. The ongoing suffering of humanity and the earth, our home, is making it difficult to get into the spirit of Advent, let alone Christmas.

This is what I need to do (and I think you might, too): Undertake a thorough examination of conscience. Be rigorously honest about my failures. Confess my sins to a priest in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Receive a healing remedy of penance and absolution.

As fun and uplifting all the decorating and partying are for "the holidays," it all eventually ends up in a dumpster (literally). But not our souls. Our souls are eternal. They require constant care.

Tuesday. A half dozen priests will be on hand for individual confessions. You've been taking care of others, your house, your yard now tend to your soul. Come, receive the gift of the Father's mercy so that you can share that mercy with others.

It might be one of the few times this season when we will all be free of pretense. We will approach God just as we are. And God will light up with love.

Speaking of Mercy:

Today at the Cathedral of Saint Andrew, Bishop David Walkowiak will open the "Door of Mercy." This will be the official launch of the "Year of Mercy" in our diocese — an "extraordinary jubilee" that will continue throughout the year.

You know we Catholics are big on rituals and symbols. We constantly try to express how our earthly lives are blended with the divine, thanks to that child born at Christmas. The Holy Doors in cathedrals throughout the world communicate that Jesus Christ is the door to God's mercy. Watch for more information about the Holy Doors in the coming months, or go to dioceseofgrandrapids.org.

t's rather ironic — no, it's *prophetic* — that as we become more frightened by the evils of terrorism, Pope Francis has scheduled a Year of Mercy. (Actually, he did that long before the latest incidents in Beirut, Paris and San Bernardino, CA.)

In a recent interview, Francis said the Holy Year is a response to the world's need for a "revolution of tenderness" from which "justice and all the rest derives."

"We are used to bad news, cruel news, and to even bigger atrocities, which offend the name and life of God," the pope told Italian magazine Credere.


Ending those tragedies requires a spirit of mercy, he said.

One way we are incorporating the **Year of Mercy** into our parish is by using the official Year of Mercy hymn at our Masses. Also, the "faith chat" on the front of the bulletin has been

> replaced with questions designed to link our Sunday readings with some of the concepts Pope Francis has asked us to focus on in the coming year, such as the Spiritual and Corporal Acts of Mercy.

> But of course, what will be most important is our individual practices of mercy within our homes, places of work and with the stranger. That will require effort, prayer and plenty of grace!

Growing in Christ Weekly Stewardship Report

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT: In today's Gospel, we hear the prophet John the Baptist being asked a profound stewardship question: "What should we do?" Each group wants to know the appropriate response to John's call; each reply points to how they should treat others. John does not simply say, "Be baptized." Rather, he points them to their jobs and personal relationships. The message of John the Baptist is simple: judgment is near, and repentance includes treating others well. We should be willing to share what we have with those in need. To listen to John the Baptist is to be called to account. 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Bless your Christmas Tree

When the tree has been prepared, but before it is illuminated, the family gathers around it.

+ All make the sign of the cross.

LEADER begins: Blessed be the name of the Lord.

ALL respond: Now and forever.

LEADER: This tree is a blessing to our home. It reminds us of all that is beautiful, all that is filled with the gentleness and the promise of God. It stands in our midst as a tree of light that we might promise to be such beauty to one another and to our world. It stands like that tree of paradise that God made into the tree of life, the cross of Jesus.

Then the scripture is read by the leader or family member: Listen to the words of the apostle Paul to Titus:

But when the kindness and generous love of our God our savior has appeared,

not because of any righteous deed we have done but because of his mercy,

he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our Savior,

so that we might be justified by His grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life. Titus 3:4-7

The Word of the Lord. ALL: Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, all join in prayers of intercession, followed by the Lord's Prayer.

The lights of the tree are now illuminated.

Leader: Let us now pray for God's blessing upon all who gather around this tree: Pause in silence

Lord our God,

We praise you for the light of creation: the sun, the moon and the stars of the night.

We praise you for the light of Israel:

The law, the prophets,

and the wisdom of the Scriptures.

We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son:

He is Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Prince of Peace, who fill us with your love.

Lord God,

let your blessing come upon us as we illuminate this tree.

May the light and cheer it gives

be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts. May all who delight in this tree, respect all life, and come to the knowledge and joy of salvation.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Leader: Let us bless the Lord. **All respond**, making the sign of the cross. **Thanks be to God.** +
