Suppose your car needs a brake job...

Should you get the "premium package" or the "midgrade?" The premium features a 3-year, 36K warranty. The midgrade has a 1-year, 10K warranty.

We face such decisions all the time. In most of these situations there is no one "right" or "wrong" answer. But how does one determine the best option; the one God is calling you to?

St. Pius X Parish is engaged in discerning a project that is as essential to our journey as a faith community as a car is essential to a family in Grandville.

Every parishioner household has been mailed a

"Case for Support" which describes plans to expand the church vestibule into a Gathering Space, build a Youth/Multipurpose Room and replace our crumbling parking lots and rusting boilers.

The mailing includes a short survey to complete and return by May 9. The survey can also be completed online at https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/ StPiusParish.

The Breton Group, a local consulting firm, has been hired to assist with this feasibility study. Some parishioners are being asked to personally meet with a member of The Breton Group for a confidential interview. If you received a survey and *prefer instead* to share your thoughts personally with The Breton Group, contact Marilyn Beckwith, parish business manager (616) 532-9344 x 102 | (mbeckwith@spxcatholic.org) this week to schedule your interview.

Whether you complete a survey or are interviewed, your feedback is confidential. All parishioner feedback will be

condensed into a final report with no names attached to specific responses.

Your feedback will be used by our leadership committees to determine whether we proceed with the project as envisioned, or adapt it based

on the input that is gathered through the questionnaires.

The proposed project is the fruit of the **Campus and Facility Master Plan** we completed last year. The priorities reflect what the parish

community expressed to the committee during that process.

Back to the brake job — That was a decision I needed to make last week for my car, a 2007 Saab 9-3 that I occasionally refer to as "my sin" because I enjoy it so much.

I opted to go with the premium brake job. It will cost \$70 more, but I tend to be rather heavy on the brakes and I want to keep that car for a long, long time. (I'd like to have some paint dings and nicks taken care of, but that's a want, not a need.)

Our parish will be here for a long time. Avoiding car payments is one way I will be able to do my share to help our parish continue its journey.
