## Biography - Major General James A. Hover

Major General James A. Hoyer assumed the duties as The Adjutant General, West Virginia Joint Forces Headquarters – West Virginia on February 1, 2011. As the Adjutant General, State of West Virginia, he provides command guidance and vision to the West Virginia Army and Air National Guard of more than 6,500 Citizen Soldiers and Airmen. He provides the overall supervision of the day to day operations and management of the readiness, fiscal, personnel, equipment, and the real property resources of the agency.

General Hoyer received his undergraduate degree from the University of Charleston and was commissioned in 1983 through a joint Reserve Officer Training Corps program with West Virginia State University. General Hoyer began his military career in the West Virginia National Guard as a Calvary Officer. He attended the Special Forces Officer Qualification course and spent over 14 years with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 19<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group. General Hoyer led the development of the West Virginia National Guard Counterdrug Task Force and the Joint Interagency Training and Education Center and its Center for National Response; a national level operational and training capability for critical infrastructure protection and consequence response. General Hoyer served as Director, Joint Staff, West Virginia Joint Force Headquarters.
