Jim Himes has been our Congressman from the 4th District since 2009. He is a member of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence and its Subcommittee on the National Security Agency and Cyber Security, as well as the House Financial Services Committee. Born in Lima, Peru to American parents, Jim spent his early years in Lima and Bogota, Columbia. He received his B.A. degree from Harvard and was a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford, where he received his Master of Philosophy in Latin American Studies. He was also awarded an Honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters from the University of Bridgeport. Jim will speak to us about happenings in Washington, D.C. Come prepared to ask him about whatever issues affecting our country interest you!
