We will be addressing areas that suffered through the drought first by over seeding and topdressing with a special mixture that should help the recovery. We have moved a couple of sprinklers already and will be continuing through this fall to improve the deficiencies that exist. This may be as simple as pulling a head out of the fescue, which we like to see, or moving it to the cart path edge that needs it.

The maintenance department has now seen some it members return to school and will be down to the winter crew by the end of this month. We will be working on several projects as time and weather allow, these will include some cart path edging, irrigation addition and winterization, evasive plant management and more .

We may naturalize or habitat some of the trees that did not make it through this year. It has been a very hard year on trees that would normally have lived. They will provide a home to other species that we will enjoy watching over the years to come.
