It means that we are fortunate to have had a select group of dedicated volunteers who shouldered the responsibilities of managing and performing all of the day-to-day operations of the club in years past. The board will be initiating fundraising campaigns for this worthwhile cause as well as setting up guidelines, a blind application process, and a scholarship committee.

VSA will be looking to support various community endeavors to include local food banks/shelters, Wounded Warrior, VDOT Adopt A Highway, and Wreaths Across America.
