WHY DO WE EXIST

- While 50% of all people from high-income families have a bachelor's degree by age 25, only 10% of people from low-income families do
- Only 21% of low-income students who enter college earn a degree in 6 years
- A graduate of a four-year college will earn almost \$1 million more than a high school graduate over a lifetime

WHO WE SERVE


- Over 100 College Scholars
- 30-40 Evanston Township High School (ETHS) sophomores selected each year according to the following criteria:
- Academic potential (minimum 2.7 GPA)
- Qualify for free or reduced lunch (85% of our Scholars)
- 1st Generation First in their families to graduate college (80% of our Scholars)
- Demonstrate qualities essential for college success that we call PERRCs (Persistence, Engagement, Resourcefulness, Responsibility and Connectedness)

COLLEGE ACCESS (HIGH SCHOOL YEARS)

Help Scholars identify, apply to, and enroll in a "good fit" college

- College visits; access to summer college and fly-in opportunities
- ACT prep class taught by a reputable ACT tutoring firm
- Workshops throughout junior and senior year
- Cohort-building activities

COLLEGE SUCCESS (COLLEGE YEARS)

- Our College Success team contacts Scholars to ensure college persistence, academic success, and access to internships and professional opportunities.
- Individual meetings each semester with ES staff
- "Tuesdays in July" weekly summer gatherings for all ES College Scholars
- Peer mentoring
- Ongoing contact with adult mentors and staff through college graduation

MENTORING

- College-educated community members help Scholars matriculate to and graduate from college.
- ES provides training, regular communications and resources to ensure mentors are well-equipped to support Scholars through the complexities of identifying and succeeding at a "good fit" college.
