March 16, 2016

The general meeting of the Agoura High School Parent Faculty Club (PFC) was held on the above date in the Community Room of the Agoura Hills Library, 30001 Ladyface Circle, Agoura Hills 91301. Co-President Lopez called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m. Parliamentarian Carole Gilligan led the flag salute. Minutes from the February 17, 2016 PFC meeting were approved.

I. AHS Administrator/Staff Reports.

• Pat Brooks, Head Counselor:

- Counselors have already met with 11th and 10th graders, and are meeting with 9th graders this week about course selection for next school year. After meeting with counselors, students will print out signature pages from Naviance for parents to sign and return to school indicating approval of student course selection for next year. Parent drop-in to meet with counselors will be held on Thursday, April 7 in Media Center from 3:00-6:00.
- Senior parents should encourage students to apply for scholarships which are posted on Naviance. Money is out there. Five scholarships have come in the last week in the range of \$500-\$1,500.
- Senior Survey will open soon on Naviance.
- Summer school with Knowledge Counts registration opens on April 11th. Concurrent enrollment forms must be filled out and submitted for approval to Mrs. Marsilio for accredited online courses offered elsewhere.

• Brian Mercer, Principal:

- Renovations to attendance office will include replacing the flooring with same flooring as main office and extend counter to make it more like a waiting room with chairs. Staff will have new desks that will face students and parents as they enter to improve customer service and improve confidentiality /visibility of staff computer screens.
- Staffing updates: Mrs. Marsilio is returning to the classroom next year and will fill an opening in the Special Ed Department. Mr. Foli will move into AP for Curriculum, and there will be an opening for AP of Athletics. Mrs. Brooks is retiring at the end of this year. Mr. Beaton is also retiring and is working on transition new head of math department. Special Ed teacher Mrs. Thompson is retiring.
- Performing Arts gala will be on June 3rd and 4th at Agoura PAEC. Friday, June 3rd will be secondary school performances. Saturday, June 4th will be Broadway Nights combining with events to benefit Performing Arts in the G Building. Audience for Saturday is more student-focused.
- The Vice Dance went well. Numbers were down, but the event broke even. Ticket sales end on Tuesday for organization and safety, but some students were frustrated they could not purchase tickets at the door. The deadline was well publicized, and students should pay attention and plan ahead.

II. Co-President's Report. Co-Presidents Liz Cangelosi and Debbie Lopez presented the Co-President's Report:

- At the LVUSD PFC Presidents' meeting there was a big discussion about The Foundation increasing its role of easing fundraising for PFC's. In the future AHS may do some joint fundraising with The Foundation.
- Natalie Spievak reported that the topic of the next Parent Ed Night is "Pot, Prom, and Promiscuity on Party Buses" and focuses on how we can keep our kids safe at prom and at parties. Mr. Mercer raised the possibility of the school sponsoring a bus for prom. It would require drug search and staff chaperone.
- If AHS wants to continue with providing Mock SAT/ACT test experiences for students on campus, a new coordinator needs to be found.

III. Guest Speaker: Shelley Diamant, Service Learning Coordinator.

- When Mrs. Diamant started 4 years ago as SLC, students had to input service hours themselves, but there were technical issues. Now the SLC team inputs the hours to make the experience as positive for students as possible. Seniors need to have their full 60 hours in the database. If they do not, they can walk at graduation, but they will not receive a diploma. Teens who do service learning have fewer problems with depression because they spend more time doing something they love for someone else. Hours can be completed in the summer prior to their next school year. Students who exceed 15 hours can apply for Service Learning Awards: Bronze = 50; Silver = 75; Gold = 100 (award hours are above and beyond the 15 hour requirement). This year's freshmen can apply for Platinum Award if they complete 100 hours per year for 4 years.
- Deadlines for Service Learning Hours submission: Seniors May 6, Juniors May 13, Sophomores May 27, Freshmen June 3.
- To add an organization to the approved list, have someone from the organization fill out a very short form and turn it in to Mrs. Diamant.
