I. AHS Administrator/Staff Reports

- **Brian Mercer, Principal.**
 - In the spirit of helping students be stress-free, Charger Chi Week has been declared for the week of December 7th with activities to help students relax. “Four-square breathing” technique was demonstrated by Principal Mercer. Therapy dogs will come in and hang out with the kids. Parents are encouraged to check in with students at home about stress levels.
 - The Fall play “On the Razzle” will be performed December 9th-12th. Tickets and show time for this “must see” production are posted on the AHS website.
 - It is tour season at AHS, most are coming from within LVUSD with 10-20 families per tour. Thanks to Mrs. Lopez, Mrs. Cangelosi, and Mrs. Golden for helping with tours, as prospective parents especially appreciate current parent perspectives. AHS does not have an enrollment problem, but we do attract families from outside the district who want to come for IB, athletics, and special programs. Tours provide a nice opportunity to brag about our school.
 - Expressed thankfulness to PFC and individual parents for all they do to partner with AHS to make it such a successful school.
 - G Building was to be updated with new sound system and lighting over Thanksgiving, but the renovation is running behind schedule. Plan is to get it done over winter break so that dance classes are not pushed out.
 - Number of students accepted via School of Choice varies from year to year and will be determined in January. For the most part, students who follow the process and do not have attendance or discipline issues will be admitted.
- **Kristen Marsilio, Assistant Principal, Curriculum & Instruction.**
 - 10th grade writing assessment was administered successfully. Only 24 students didn’t take it, 10 of whom took the make up. AHS teachers are partnering with CHS teachers to norm grading standards. 10th grade papers will be read by 3 different teachers, ensuring that regardless of which teacher a student has, his/her assessment will be evaluated consistently with those of other students.
 - Final exam period is quickly approaching. The only major change is that world language will not be giving exams in December, but instead will move to January due to student needs for more time to adapt to new textbooks/curriculum/materials. Math finals will still take place the Thursday and Friday before winter break. 15-week progress reports will be available after December 9th.
 - Extended counselor hours are available daily for drop-ins and appointments from 7:00 – 7:50 a.m., as well as Monday & Wednesday afternoons from 3:00-4:00. Please take advantage of extended counseling hours.
 - Governor Brown signed a bill suspending the CAHSEE exam for 3 years. Seniors will not be denied a diploma if they did not pass last year’s exam, and juniors and sophomores will not have additional administrations of exams. This is an across-the-board State decision.

II. Co-President’s Report. Co-Presidents Liz Cangelosi and Debbie Lopez welcomed attendees and presented the Co-President’s Report.

- **District Updates:**
 - Measure E passed, ensuring \$2.3 million in funding for LVUSD per year for the next 12 years.
 - Linda Menges and Mathy Wasserman will be sworn in at the December meeting as new LVUSD School Board members.
 - Currently, students must complete two years of math in order to graduate from LVUSD. The School Board is considering raising it to three years.

- **AHS PFC Updates:**
 - Today is the final meeting of 2015.

III. Guest Speakers

- **Lena Goryoka, Media Clerk @ AHS.** Thanks the PFC for generosity to Media Center over the years.
 - Agoura Hills & Westlake Libraries have joined resources with our AHS Library, providing students with broader access to library materials and support.
 - The Media Center has become standing room only, and there is now a Café Area where students can eat and talk with peers. Computers have been updated and are well-used, and Ipads are available for catalog searches. Newest addition is Presentation/Collaboration Room which provides space for students to practice public speaking/presentations with Smart TV to display from laptops and whiteboard access.
 - Genius Bar is now available for Tech Team students to support peers with Acer issues. Overnight loaners are available if repair requires more time. The Media Center also supplies calculators, library books, and textbooks. More charging stations are needed (looking into solar) and hoping for more relaxed lounge-type furniture for the front of the Media Center. Only 1 full-time staff dedicated to Media Center, so parent volunteers are relied upon and needed.
- **Tina Johnson, LVUSD Librarian.** AHS Library is a leader in terms of LVUSD libraries.
 - Painting taking place in Charger colors to brighten up the AHS Media Center. Seating arranged from lower in the front to higher in the back so that Mrs. Goryoka can manage/oversee students.
 - Research shows that having educated librarians in schools increases student achievement, but there is only one librarian at 70% for all of the K-12 schools in LVUSD. Agoura & WLV are both LA County libraries. Mrs. Johnson is bringing in County librarians to work with and train students on resources available in order to increase student access to trained librarians. The Calabasas Library is a city library that withdrew from the County system, so it can tailor programs to meet the school district's needs. The Calabasas Library provides funds to LVUSD to buy materials for students. Non-fiction materials are quite dated, so funding being used to update that collection.
 - A new initiative provides students on campus access to and download capability from the Calabasas Library database (which is the same as the database students will need to use in college), bypassing the need for library cards when at school:
http://galepages.com/calabasas_main.
 - The Calabasas Library has purchased over 700 non-fiction e-books with unlimited simultaneous check outs, which are also tied in to Google classroom and can be downloaded to Chrome. Students are encouraged to get Calabasas Library cards so they can access these resources from home. All residents of California are eligible for Calabasas Library cards. Mrs. Goryoka will pick up library cards for students who turn in the signed form to her. LVUSD needs and encourages parent participation in the district libraries. Please contact tjohnson@lvusd.org with any help or support.
