AHS PFC Minutes of General Board Meeting February 17, 2016

I. AHS Administrator/Staff Reports.

- **Brian Mercer, Principal:**

- Several campus upgrades are underway. Site funds are being spent on new handicapped-accessible benches as well as “Apple Café” type upgrades to Media Center (which will create an area that encourages students to work collaboratively by providing lounge chairs and tables with plug-ins). Working with City of AH as well as site funds to pay for these upgrades as well as cafeteria painting and a new student mural.
- Mr. Busby is stepping down after many years of service as ASB Director. Kristen Rogers has been hired as new ASB Director, and Mrs. Brennan and Mrs. Shields will be assisting in a new team format.
- One goal for next year is to increase RTI to help at-risk students and offer additional intervention classes. All students who took the transitional 8th-9th intervention classes have expressed an interest in continuing with the program next year. Students will use elective period to take RTI for English or Math. This will not be possible without PFC support and LCAP funding. Classes will not be removed from Master Schedule to accommodate the new RTI classes. Classes that do not meet minimum enrollment, however, will not continue to be offered. Unfortunately, the creative writing class will not be offered next year since it has not met the 25 student minimum enrollment. Many aspects of creative writing are included in journalism, so the hope is to encourage students who want additional writing classes to enroll in journalism.

- **Kristen Marsilio, Assistant Principal, Curriculum & Instruction:**

- Counselors were available last week for students having trouble with log in problems on Naviance. Naviance closes Monday 2/22. Write any questions or concerns you have about your student’s schedule for next year on a notecard and have students discuss with counselor. Counselor will take notes for student to send back to you. If you still have questions, come to the parent drop in.
- Master schedule process has gotten tighter and tighter, and schedule changes are increasingly difficult to make. The message that is going out for next school year is that changes will only be made based on: staff error, if student took summer school, level changes, or if a student needs a class but did not take it in summer school.
- Elective class changes will not be made in the fall, so be sure that your student is okay with their three elective course options.
- New AP Computer Principles course has been approved, which will provide an introduction/exploration of cyber security, coding, problem solving, and other aspects of computer principles.
- PE Yoga has also been approved for 10th grade PE or as an elective.
- Despite 2/22 Naviance deadline, schedule changes can also be made after parent drop-in with counselor and then again in May. Take the time to go through the process of vetting classes and making decisions throughout this spring semester. Classes will not be easily changeable after the May deadline.

II. Co-President’s Report. Co-Presidents Liz Cangelosi and Debbie Lopez presented the Co-President’s Report:

- Grad Night Garage Sale will take place on Saturday, March 12th from 7:00 – 11:00 a.m. in the teachers’ parking lot at AHS. The tradition is to rely on parents of juniors to run as much as possible of Grad Nite so senior parents can enjoy the graduation experience.
- LVUSD is looking for citizens to volunteer on the Measure G Oversight Committee.
- LVUSD is also seeking substitute teachers, with the District offering to provide some training, especially in science and math.
- District-wide Google calendar is in the works.
- Several PFC Board positions are open for next year.

III. Guest Speaker: Kristen Rogers, ATC, Athletic Trainer/Teacher, Agoura High School.

- Ms. Rogers is available from 12:30-4:00 to provide rehab and evaluation for athletes and refer students to a doctor if needed. She is also present at all Varsity athletic events, as well as most JV & FS events. Any students interested in investigating the medical field can join her Sports Medicine class. This year, the Sports Medicine class has 74 students who all get CPR certified and engage in a 20-hour (minimum) internship. Students are first responders at athletic events. The goal of the Sports Medicine class is to open up a career path for students who may be interested in medicine and provide them with a hands-on experience to confirm their interest, or realize it is not their thing. Many students do 40-50 hours in the internship. Any hours above and beyond the 20-hour internship count as Community Service Hours.

IV. Open Q&A.

- A parent raised a concern about girls restroom not being clean or accessible. Mr. Mercer explained that this year only three bathrooms are open during instructional periods to ensure bathroom supervision. Which bathrooms are open rotates on a monthly basis and announcements are made to students.
- Hope to use LCAP funds to purchase new modular tables/desks that allow for flexible seating arrangements, as well as new chairs for music department.
- For this year and the next two years, school will start on the second to last Wednesday in August.

V. Committee/Booster Written Reports. Documents (including Meeting Agenda, Minutes from the 01/20/16 PFC meeting, and PFC Committee and Budget Reports) for today's meeting were available via link on the weekly PFC e-news blast.
