MCS MIDDLE SCHOOL 6TH GRADE ELECTIVE OPTIONS FOR 2016-2017 SCHOOL YEAR

ADVANCED INSTRUMENTAL ENSEMBLE: A.I.E. is designed to further explore musical styles including worship, symphonic, and popular music. This is open to all instrumentalists! Experience of at least one-year band/orchestra or private lessons is preferred but not required. Choose AIE...develop your skills, have fun, make friends, perform, and prepare for your future! When students join A.I.E. they will have the opportunity to participate in the following music group(s):

STRING ORCHESTRA: Join this talented group of string players (violin, viola, cello, bass) who make great music together! Students will participate in on and off-campus performances and progress through one of six tracks for theory and technique designed to challenge each student at his or her own level. Orchestra students will serve MCS and the community through musical outreach and service projects.

ADVANCED BAND: The MCS Advanced Band rehearses and performs patriotic, Christmas, jazz, and other popular music throughout the year. The Advanced Band performs for events both on campus and in our surrounding community.

<u>Important Note Regarding AIE</u>—this is **not** a Friday elective. AIE takes place on Tuesday and Thursday during 2nd period when 6th grade students are enrolled in a Study Skills class. Students who choose to take AIE as their elective will be enrolled in Study Skills on Friday in lieu of a Friday elective. In addition, students in AIE will not be enrolled in the second semester Art enrichment course.

COMMUNICATIONS: Are you interested in exploring different forms of media and communications? Do you like to gab? Do you like the challenge of defending your opinions when others don't agree? If so, then Communications 101 is for you! This elective will equip you with skills for public speaking (speech), debate, and journalism. We will also learn how to create a solid argument and develop presentation skills through opportunities focused on real audiences and meaningful issues.

GAME PROGRAMMING WITH GAMEMAKER SOFTWARE: This elective will provide an introduction to the basics of developing games using a visual programming environment. After learning the basics of coding, students will apply their new skills to developing their own game to enjoy and share with others by the end of the course.

PEER ASSISTANCE LEADERSHIP: In 2014, MCS Middle School became an official **PAL**® school as we launched this great program with our 7th and 8th grade students. In 2015, we were excited to expand the program to provide 6th graders the opportunity to participate through the Peer Assistance Leadership elective. The mission of this elective is to enable young people to use their potential and God given gifts in leadership to make a difference in the school and the community. Through **PAL**®, students will develop leadership skills, be trained with specific peer-conflict resolution strategies, and learn how to participate in productive pursuits with peers using positive decision making, higher order thinking skills, and team building. And two of the greatest bonuses to being in PAL—middle school students become reading buddies with our lower elementary students and all students participating in PAL support ASB in planning events throughout the semester. If you want to develop your leadership skills and make a difference in our school, join PAL!

TECHNICAL ARTS I: This elective course is designed to train middle school students about the growing world of technology through audio-visual engineering from a Christian perspective. Students will obtain a general understanding of audio-visual engineering, learn how to work with an audio-visual team in a biblically based environment and develop a working knowledge of the latest cutting edge technology used in the industry including operating a soundboard, lighting board, camera and computer graphics.

THEATER ARTS: This course is designed for students with all levels and experience in theater. It will focus on elements of acting including stage movement, character development, and acting techniques. Students will also work in depth on improvisation and audition skills. In addition, students will be provided opportunities to become comfortable on stage and in front of an audience through improv games and skits.

WORSHIP: New next year! Develop a heart for leading others in worship while growing in your own musical abilities. This includes so much more than just performing on stage. This elective will explore many aspects of worship and provide opportunities to lead worship in chapel. The main goal will be to prepare and equip students as worshipers first and foremost. Secondly; equip students to lead in worship whether as a musician, worshiper, sound/tech person, or out in our communities as followers of Jesus. Students do not need to be on the middle school worship team to participate in this elective. A heart and passion for learning more and developing skills in leading worship is the only requirement!
