What is Cub Scout Twilight Camp?

Do I have to be a scout to come to camp?

Simply put—No. Membership with the Boy Scouts of America is not a requirement to register for the Aquila District Cub Scout Twilight Camp. We have created a fun and interesting program for boys & girls alike. Youth who want to attend, but are not registered scouts, must have an adult (at least 18 years old) attend with them.

Twilight Camp is a unique program.

Youth who have just completed 1st to 4th grade are grouped by grade level. Youth experience age appropriate activities under the guidance of trained adult leaders and teen assistants called Den Chiefs. Youth who have just completed kindergarten are eligible for the Tiger camp with a parent attending and walking with them. We also have a tot lot camp for staff children only (3 years old potty trained to 1st grade age).

How much does Twilight Camp cost?

The camp fee is \$50 for graduating kindergarten to 4th graders. Tot Lot Staff Kids camp is \$30 for staff children. Adults Volunteers are \$10 for camp supplies and Teen Volunteers (13-17) are free. Time worked can be used for community service hours at most schools. After April 27th there will be a late fee for kids attending camp!

What is required to sign up?

All adults working camp must agree to a background check for the safety of all children. Also they will have to fill out a medical form, attend one of the training sessions listed on our calendar and take Youth Protection Training in a classroom. Training lasts about 2-1/2 hours for both. We want to make sure all adults know what to expect and how to handle any emergency situations for the safety of all involved. What are some of the activities:

Safety training for each of the shooting sports, then campers will be shooting BB-guns, archery and wrist rockets. We believe that by allowing kids to learn about how to safely handle or not handle weapons, we are protecting our youth. All campers will be doing leatherworking and a woodworking project to take home. We will have a lot of different crafts for each grade level. Forth and fifth graders will be doing first aid training, More details are on our webpage.
