The Central African
Republic has experienced
hundreds of allegations of
human rights violations
since the introduction of UN
Peacekeepers to the region.
These Peacekeepers were
sent to the C.A.R. in order
to promote peace among
those engaged in a fierce
political battle that has been
the source of widespread
violence for the past 5
years.

This crisis in the Central African Republic has led to thousands of people being displaced from their homes and seeking shelter or asylum in other neighboring countries and beyond. The UN Peacekeepers as they are called, are drawn from a multinational effort born in the United Nations to try and help in this volatile situation.

So where does the line get drawn between the authority to help keep the peace and using that authority to abuse refugees? To date, both non-UN and UN Peacekeeping forces have reportedly discarded human rights from their agenda in the name of keeping the peace, and have even gone so far as to rape hundreds of refugees, many of whom are

children.

The results thus far are that the UN Peacekeeper chief of staff for that region has been removed and discussions are underway at UN Headquarters to determine the future of operations there and to hopefully bring those accused to justice if found guilty.

## The New Wild West: Surfing the "Dark Web"

The "dark web" is the new frontier for those wishing to browse the internet with total anonymity and do everything from purchasing weapons to hiring assassins. Originally developed by the United States Military for the exchange of anonymous information, this largely undiscovered internet network is starting to raise a lot of attention in the international community. It was released to the public in order to increase the number of people using it so that those messages that were government related and those that were not would

become even harder to identify.

The end result has been the creation of an internet underworld that functions very similarly to the "black market," since people can gain access to the purchase of a variety of otherwise illegal merchandise and morally reprehensible services, including purchasing slaves.

"TOR", otherwise known as "The Onion Router" is a browsing software that is required to gain access to the "dark web." However, there are now a variety of other browsing

programs that function in the same way, giving access to some 30,000 websites in total, all of which keep their activity hidden.

However, there is a positive to this, which is that for people living in nations whose laws censor certain internet access, they now have ways of accessing it without fear of government reprisal. In many nations, the penalty for accessing non-government websites is imprisonment or death. In either case, the "dark web" is now the "Wild West" of our time.

### Heartache and Suffering: Slavery in Brazil

There is a journey across the North of Brazil that if survived, few ever forget. This is the slavery road, along which thousands of poor workers are trafficked, beaten, threatened, and forced to work without pay. Many slaves have been rescued, but the total number of those who have not is unknown at this time.

The journey begins in the Northeastern states such as Marannao and Piaui, known for their high poverty rates, all the way to Northern Brazil at the beginning of the Amazon rainforest. It is estimated that as many as 4.9 million people have been enslaved in Brazil since the colonization in the 1500s.

Victims often live without proper sanitation, food or shelter, and are often viewed as animals by their owners. Sexual exploitation is common amongst children, a practice that is highly utilized by truck drivers that pass by the route taken by the slaves. The forest itself is also

dangerous, filled with lethal creatures such as jaguars, vipers, and scorpions.

When people are lucky enough to be rescued, it is not unheard of to migrate again to the same place due to recapture. Most are simply in a state of hopelessness. It is sad to think that long after we abolished slavery in our own country, it still exists anywhere in the world today.
