PASSPORT REQUIREMENT

All travelers to Mexico must have a passport and proof of citizenship to reenter the US. There are no exceptions. New or Renewal \$110; apply at a US Post office.

INSURANCE INCLUDED

Insurance covers emergency medical treatment and medical evacuation. It covers trip interruption and partially covers cancellation (for good reason such as illness).

WHAT TO BRING

In addition to your clothing, daily medication, and toiletries, you will need your sleeping bag, passport, flashlight, towel, and a roll of toilet paper. Physicians and nurses may need hand instruments, rubber gloves, medicines, BP cuff, and stethoscope. You may also wish to bring a pillow, earplugs, snacks, and a Swiss army knife.

MEDICAL SPANISH

Our Medical Spanish pages are available on request. Let us know if you want to receive them. It is especially good for those who know some Spanish already, but would like to brush up on medical vocabulary. We will, of course, provide translators to assist you.

THE VILLAGES:

Tatoxcac and Ixtepec are above 6,000 feet in altitude in the Sierra Madre of the State of Puebla. Most of the people are descended from the Aztecs. Many still speak the ancient languages of Nahuatl and Totonaca.

WEATHER AND CLOTHING: Tatoxcac and Ixtepec are about 6,000 feet in altitude in the Sierra Madre. April weather in the mountains of Mexico is like April here—anywhere from 30 to 65 degrees. (Warm by day and cool at night). Take jeans, sneakers, sweater, rain gear, and jacket. Wear scrubs or lab coat when "on duty." Shorts are seldom worn in Mexico and should be conservative. Women do wear slacks in Mexico, but tank tops and bare midriffs are not appropriate. Our clothing should project an image of "camping" in the villages, "casual" in Puebla.
