## Texas Empresarios – Austin or De León Compare and Contrast Worksheet

**Introduction:** Between 1824 and 1832, the Mexican government granted Texas colonization contracts to almost two dozen men. While all of these men made their mark on Texas history, two of them stand out. These men and their colonies would have a significant impact upon Texas. One, a native Mexican and the other a former American, rose to almost legendary status because of their role in the colonization of Texas. While they had some things in common, they were also quite different. This exercise will focus on the similarities and differences of Stephen F. Austin and Martin De León.
