### **Types of Government**

Governments can be classified by who holds the power! Is one person in charge? Is there a group of people who share the power? Governments can also be classified by how power is attained. Did the citizens or subjects authorize the power to be given to an individual or group? Are there governing documents that outline and prescribe by law how the power will be held or divided?

Although there are many ways to classify governments, we will utilize these two criteria: Who holds the power and how was power attained?

Students will search online for definitions of each form of government and then give a modern day example of a country with each form of government to complete the worksheet. Class discussion can follow the completion of the worksheet to reinforce the concepts.
