## A Day of "Heavy Metal" in Ann Arbor (01)

On this unique trip you will see and hear "heavy metal" on two unique organs and the Charles Baird Carillon. The organs will include the 1985 organ by Karl Wilhelm at the First Congregational Church which has 2,700 pipes, and the 1893/1927/1955 Frieze Organ in Hill Auditorium which has 7,500 pipes. These two instruments show different approaches to organ building while retaining "heavy metal"



pipes of lead, tin, zinc, as well as wood. We'll also listen to the Charles Baird Carillon, the third largest carillon in the world. It has 53 bronze bells and the largest one weighs 12 tons! We will be allowed into the bell chamber and see and hear the instrument while it is being played by our performer/host Kipp Cortez, Director of Music and Organist at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Ann Arbor. The trip also includes lunch at the Cottage Inn in downtown Ann Arbor, and motorcoach transportation from SVSU.
