

Drucilla Stender Ramey is a legal community leader who focuses her management consulting practice on diversity, public interest law, pro bono, and leadership issues. Dru assists law firms, bar associations, legal non-profits, law schools and corporate law departments in the development of programs and initiatives that have a positive impact on the legal profession and lead to meaningful institutional change.

Dru was formerly Executive Director of the Bar Association of San Francisco (BASF), Executive Director of the National Association of Women Judges (NAWJ), and most recently Dean of the Golden Gate University Law School (GGU Law) in San Francisco. As a consultant, she has assisted a number of non-profits, foundations, and legal advocacy groups in the development and expansion of race, gender diversity, and pro bono initiatives.

While at BASF, she developed the largest bar-sponsored diversity and pro bono legal services programs in the U.S. and was co-founder of the California Minority Counsel Program, among other ground-breaking initiatives. At NAWJ, she served as national spokesperson diversity in the judiciary and legal profession, while doubling the organization's operating budget and tripling reserves. And as Dean at GGU Law she worked to enhance practical skills training opportunities across the curriculum, while expanding student interest and participation in the Public Interest Law Program and pro bono opportunities.

A charismatic public speaker and fierce civil rights advocate, Dru has been a national spokesperson on issues relating to diversity in the legal profession for more than 40 years. A graduate of Harvard University and Yale Law School, and former Chair of the San Francisco Commission on the Status of Women, Dru has received numerous honors and awards in recognition of the contributions she has made to the legal profession, including the prestigious Margaret Brent Women Lawyers of Achievement Award – the American Bar Association's highest honor for women in the profession, the American Jewish Committee's Learned Hand Award and the California Women Lawyers' Fay Stender Award.
