

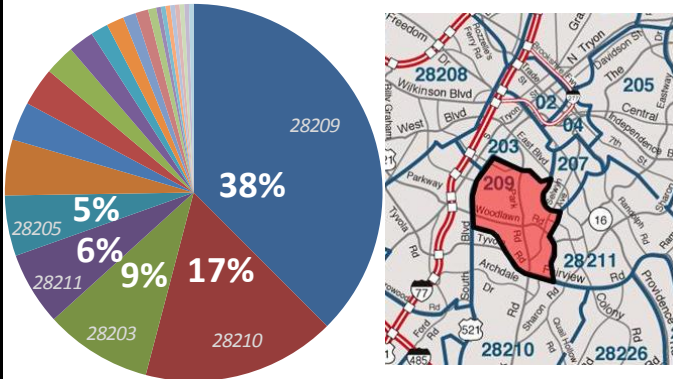
Park Woodlawn Neighborhood Rebranding Survey Results

August 2015

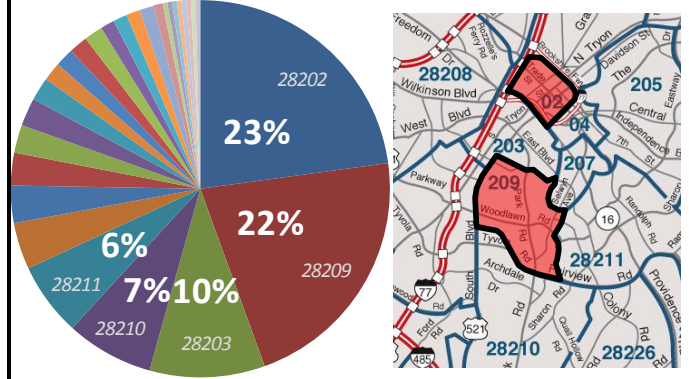

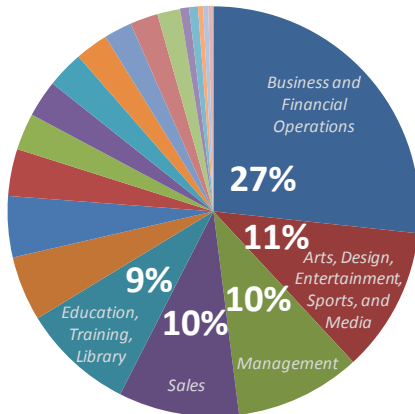

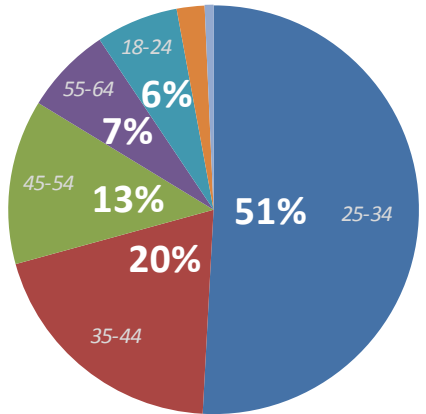
Occupation



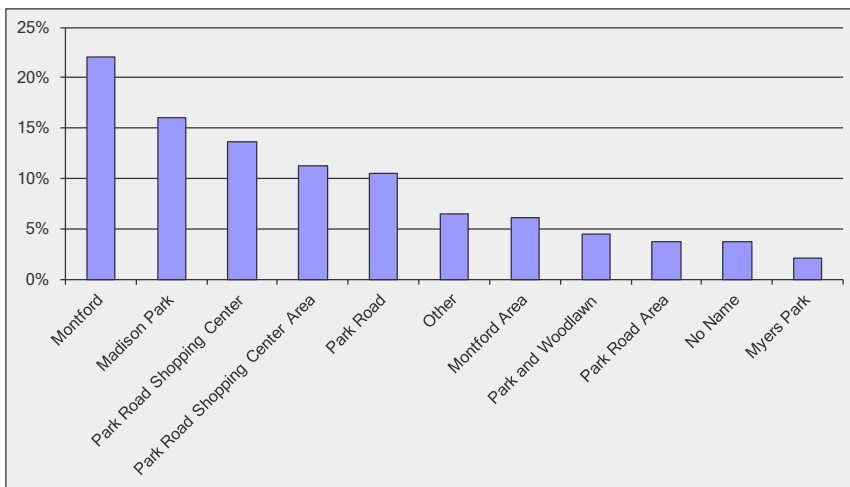
Years living in Charlotte

What do you currently call the neighborhood?

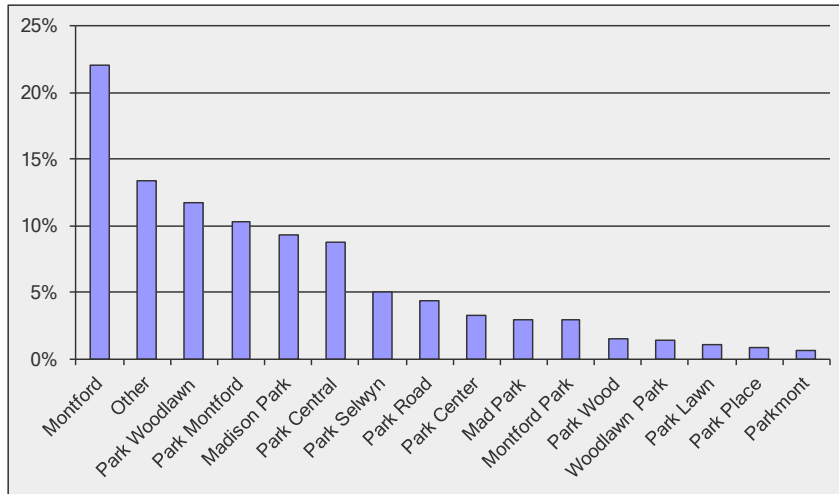
