Goals & Objectives

Course Goal: Participants will receive a comprehensive review of anatomy, pathology, and pathophysiology of joint injury and degeneration. Participants will learn diagnostic and treatment and rehabilitative methods including uktrasound, injection therapies, OMT, Orthopaedic Medicine and nutritional and hormonal therapies to treat common pain conditions.

At the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Understand the available research on regenerative injection (Prolotherapy) treatments, including applications in pediatric, adult and elderly populations.
- Perform, Evaluate and Interpret Diagnostic Ultrasound of the Hip, Knee and Ankle.
- Explain the biology of proper healing and the disease processes that impede healing of musculoskeletal tissue.
- Describe the pathophysiology of spinal segment sensitization and its role in chronic pain.
- Perform physical medicine examination and interventions in cases of spinal segment sensitization.
- Perform hands on diagnosis to determine sources of chronic non-malignant pain.
- Assess several injection techniques and solutions for treating chronic pain.
- Perform various Intra and Extra-articular Injection treatments for treating pain conditions.
- Describe investigational use of Platelet-Rich plasma and Autologous Stem Cell Therapy for treating Knee Osteoarthrosis.
- Perform some examination and evaluation methodologies for the knee, hip/pelvis, shoulder, and foot/ankle.
- Propose how various exercise and rehabilitation strategies can be integrated into treatment protocols to enhance proper healing of musculoskeletal tissues.
- Understand Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment in chronic pain conditions.
- Propose how injection therapies can be integrated into treatment protocols to enhance proper healing and affect chronic pain conditions.
- Determine appropriate use of diagnostic ultrasound to aid injection needle placement in treating with injection therapies.

INTENDED AUDIENCE

This conference was designed for those using Orthopaedic Medicine to treat performance related pain and injury, overuse syndromes and chronic pain conditions. The conference will include lectures and workshops on anatomy, diagnosis and treatment of chronic pain using Orthopaedic Medicine and injection therapies.
