

# The Don Brown Memorial Scholarship

This award is open to high school seniors and students currently enrolled in an accredited university. It is given to support and encourage a deserving student pursuing a career in ministry, human services or a related field. Strong preference will be given to applicants who have spent time working to alleviate hunger and poverty in their home communities, and particularly to students who have volunteered with our agency or on its behalf. Paterson residents and first generation college students will also receive special consideration.

An award in the amount of \$500 will be given for the purchase of, or reimbursement for, books and other material that support educational pursuits. The application opens on May 1st and closes June 30, 2015.
