What to look out for during a renovation:

Who is watching your contractors?

- Hire a professional <u>Home & Property Consultant</u> as <u>your</u> pair of eyes.
- Once we have made our assessment, discuss any problems with the contractor and the quality of their work. Discuss what mistakes were made and what steps will be taken to correct the issue. Discuss the deadline for corrections to be made and note if the contractor is being cooperative or not.
- Take pictures to document progress at every stage of the renovation project.
- Mistakes do happen even with the best contractors.
- Some mistakes are easy to hide from the lay person (i.e. electrical, plumbing) especially once the drywall is installed.
- Are permits taken out; will your insurance be void, if they are not?
- Are there 'add-ons' you're faced with really necessary?
- What time are the workers to signing on /off from work? (Are they in full compliance with your contract agreement?)
- Don't let things get from bad-to-worse and end-up in court, or costing you extra.
- Keep control of the project and maintain the power!
- Don't ever allow yourself to be bullied or pressured!
- Ensure the invoices are accurate and you're not overpaying!
- Be aware that "The City" is not mandated to look out for you.
- Know your rights; wise to seek legal advice before commencing.
