Over 7,000 came to hear President Clinton and his interview with AIA President Richter. Israeli/Canadian/American architect Moshe Safdie, FAIA received the 2015 AIA Gold Medal, and the AUA (African Union of Architects) signed the Africa Sustainability Campaign Cooperation Agreement. The ARCASIA President shared Nepal relief updates and discussed next steps with AIA-IR and national leadership.

Report from George Kunihiro, FAIA, AIA International Director

The AIA Strategic Council

On the Washington front, the AIA Strategic Council is moving forward in its mission to identify the issues that the AIA needs to take on as challenges. Since the Institute's fiduciary role has been placed in the hands of the new Board, the Strategic Council is now free to involve itself with issues directly related to the profession, to society, and to our global environment. The goal of the "repositioning" initiative is for the AIA to become ever-more relevant, and we are on our way.

The Strategic Council has organized several committees to formulate a list of topics to take up for the coming year. As you have learned in this issue of the IR Newsletter, our own **Thierry Paret** has been elected as the "At-Large" Representative to the Council. Along with the incoming representative of the International Region, there will be a larger IR voice in Washington next year. The Strategic Council, as well as the Board, recognizes the importance of the global community; thus our role as the representative of the AIA in many regions of the world will become more critical in the coming year.

Preparation for the Kyoto Conference is Underway

Meanwhile, preparation for the first IR Conference is well on its way in Kyoto, Japan. Our theme "Global Relevance: Looking Up" is timely as the domestic economy has improved and more architects and their firms are looking outwards and are ready to be engaged in global practice.

AIA Japan, the host chapter, is celebrating its tenth year and our membership is working hard to organize what we hope will be a memorable conference in the heritage city of Kyoto.

In the conference, there will be a line up of well-respected keynote speakers who have very active global practices and who can share their experiences with our members. **Fumihiko Maki, Hon. FAIA**, a U.S. educated architect and a Pritzker Prize laureate, has a number of buildings to his credit in the U.S. and in Canada including Number 4 World Trade Center, the latest high-rise tower to be completed in the redevelopment of New York City's downtown Manhattan area.

Kengo Kuma, Hon. FAIA, continues a long list of important Japanese architects who practice globally, such as Tange, Maki, Ando and Ito. He has offices in Tokyo, Beijing and Paris and has built in the U.S. Kuma is the next generation of the "global influencer" in architecture. **Ken Yeang, Hon. FAIA**, is a U.K.- educated Malaysian architect with offices in Kuala Lumpur and London, whose works have influenced the course of green architecture around the world.

Besides the lineup of respected speakers and a program designed to share information across the International Region, we are planning to take you outside to the streets of Kyoto with special daily tours in the afternoons, focusing on the tradition and culture of the city as well as a full-day excursion to the Miho Museum by I. M. Pei, Byodoin Temple, a World Heritage Site, and other special destinations.

To make your visit truly memorable, our committee has organized the farewell party in a unique setting of Kodaiji Temple, a Buddhist temple with a breathtaking "lightscape" in the garden.

For those of you who are interested in an extended visit in Japan, we are also offering a cultural and sport tour of the northern island of Hokkaido. This two-day package includes visits to the works of Isamu Noguchi, the 20th Century Japanese-American sculptor, and Kan Yasuda, a contemporary sculptor who works in Italy and Japan—as well as a round of golf at one of the premier golf courses in Northern Japan.

Members of AIA Japan and the IR Conference Organizing Committee are looking forward to welcoming you to Japan to see the wonders of both the old and the new in the city of Kyoto.

Delegates to the American Institute of Architects (AIA) national convention in Atlanta elected **Thomas V. Vonier, FAIA**, (AIA Continental Europe) 2016 AIA First Vice President/2017 President at AIA. Jennifer Workman, AIA, L. Jane Frederick, FAIA, and Anthony P. Schirripa, FAIA, have been elected to serve as the At-large Director; Stuart L. Coppedge, AIA, has been elected 2016–2017 Treasurer.

Three additional At-large Directors were appointed to the Strategic Council in advance of AIA Convention 2015. They were **Thierry Paret, FAIA** (AIA Middle East), Donald King, FAIA, and Deepika Padam, AIA.

Currently serving as 2014–2015 AIA Vice President, Vonier is also the founder and past president of AIA Continental Europe from 1994 to 1995. He served on the AIA Board of Directors representing the AIA International Region from 2010 to 2012. Vonier received an M.Arch. and a B.Arch. from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee after attending the school of architecture at Washington University in St. Louis. He is also currently Secretary General of the International Union of Architects, after previously serving as its Vice President. Tom Vonier was also instrumental in the creation of the Middle East Chapter and continues to be a strong supporter. Tom Vonier and Thierry Paret will be the only two serving board members from the International Region (AIA Continental Europe Chapter and AIA Middle East Chapter).

The AIA National Board is responsible for providing operational and fiduciary management of the Institute. The newly reduced board will be made up of:

Four Elected Officers (elected by the delegates at the annual convention)

- AIA President (one-year term)
- First Vice President/President-elect (one-year term, then automatically succeeding to the Presidency)
- Secretary (two-year term)
- Treasurer (two-year term)

Six At-Large Directors

- Three At-Large Directors elected by the delegates at the annual convention (three-year terms)
- Three At-Large Directors elected by the Strategic Council (one to three-year terms)
- As many as two At-Large Directors selected by the President but subject to Board approval (terms no longer than the selecting President's term)
- Associate Director (two-year term)
- A **CACE Director** (one-year term)
- A Student Director
- The AIA's **EVP/Chief Executive Officer** (a non-voting member)

The votes received by proxy and by those attending the 2015 annual members' meeting in Atlanta on May 14, 2015 have been vetted by the AIA's Legal Counsel for the offices of First Vice President/President-elect and Treasurer for the International Region.

Thierry Paret, FAIA was elected as First Vice President for 2016-2017 and President for 2017-2018, and **Loay Quota, AIA** was elected as Treasurer for 2016-2017. The two former AIA Middle East Chapter Presidents will work with the International Region's Board of Directors to further develop the AIA's international initiatives.

The **AIA Hong Kong** chapter focus for 2015 is *Architecture and Cities*, following the 2014 focus on *Innovation, Invention and Inspiration*. Monthly speakers, events and seminars have been planned, organized and executed to raise awareness of various aspects of *Innovation, Invention and Inspiration*.

We have also started a Young Architects Group (YAG) to attract younger members and to address the specific needs of emerging architects - such as the ARE exam, training, mentoring, cutting edge technologies, sustainable materials and innovative strategies for design. YAG was also set up to provide a platform for emerging architects to discuss their views on Architecture and Cities and the future of the profession.

The Chapter continues to work to update members on an existing agreement which allows for reciprocal recognition and membership with the Hong Kong Institute of Architects (HKIA), in which AIA members who meet certain requirements are eligible for an examination and professional interview leading to HKIA membership, which can have benefits for members working here, as well as in China.

Work in Mainland China has slowed, yet some development continues, partially due to China's less-intricate ties to the western financial markets, as well as to a stated commitment on the part of the Chinese government to invest heavily in infrastructure over the next five years. Macau, Southeast Asia and especially India are showing signs of improvement and there are future prospects for members and architectural practices in Hong Kong.

AIA Hong Kong continues to work closely with other professional organizations in Hong Kong and participate in local events and activities. We also interact closely with Hong Kong Government Departments and invite their key staff to conduct tours and participate at AIA Hong Kong events to raise the profile of AIA Hong Kong locally.

What's Happening

Since the beginning of the year, the Hong Kong chapter has featured an unusually large number of building tours, in addition to our regular roster of seminars, quarterlies, and other events.

Coming Up

The annual **AIA Hong Kong Honors & Awards Ceremony** will be held on Wednesday, September 30th and submissions are due by July 17.

Herman Miller's Living Office Presentation

With the advent of personal mobile devices, we can now work anywhere and anytime of our choosing. Is the traditional workplace becoming obsolete? What will be the most critical elements and values for the 21st century workplace? These are some of the questions posed in this lecture by **Maria Andreu** of Herman Miller Japan. An innovative idea called the *Living Office* is proposed by Herman Miller. Companies must attract, nurture, enable, and retain talent to drive innovation in the 21st century. The Living Office becomes a platform for spiritual connection to work and colleagues, enhancing the human experience of interaction and creation. Each Living Office is unique, tailored to fit the purpose, character and activities of the company and to enable and empower its workers. The Living Office design is created by analyzing the ten modes of work and ten distinct workplace settings to determine what are the priorities. By selecting and composing workplace settings with furnishings to match each setting, an office landscape can be created to form the basis for the new office design.

Dimitra Tsachrelia is an associate of Steven Holl Associates and she was the assistant Project Architect for the Reid Building. She was in Japan with students from Columbia University where she teaches with Steven Holl at the Advanced Architectural Design Studio Master's Program.

REID BUILDING, THE GLASGOW SCHOOL OF ART Glasgow, United Kingdom. The Reid Building, designed by Steven Holl Architects, is situated across from the historic Charles Rennie Mackintosh building in Glasgow and has an area of 11,250 sm for the Art and Design school, including studios, project spaces, lecture theater, seminar rooms, cafe, exhibition, and academic administrative spaces.

The Reid building, which is named after former GSA Director, Dame Seona Reid, opened in April 2014 and received the ARCHITECTS JOURNAL - AJ100 BUILDING OF THE YEAR 2014 award in the UK, 2014.

Japanese Architecture: "What It Is, What It Ain't", Professor Dana Buntrock Lecture

Architecture Professor **Dana Buntrock** of the University of California, Berkeley, currently hosted at University of Tokyo, has been selected to be incoming Chair for the Center of Japanese Studies at UC Berkeley beginning in the 2016 school year. Before her departure, Dana shared her views on why she believes energy issues in Japanese buildings are a lower priority for architects here, and also shared broader reflections on the state of the profession in Japan.

High-Performance Buildings: Adding Value by Subtracting Energy, James Scott Brew, AIA

James Scott Brew, AIA is a member of AIA Japan, a Fellow of the Construction Specifications Institute, a LEED Accredited Professional and a Certified Passivhaus Consultant. He recently moved to Japan to join KPMG AZSA Sustainability Co., Ltd., where he serves as a Senior Manager of the Built Environment Sustainability Services team—specializing in ultra low-energy design for new and existing buildings, campuses, and cities. Before joining KPMG, James co-led the buildings practice at Rocky Mountain Institute (RMI, Boulder, Colorado) working around the world on major sustainability projects. Prior to RMI, James was a senior VP/shareholder of his own, Minnesota-based, architecture/engineering firm, helping to grow the firm to nearly 200 people prior to selling his stock in 2007.

SUMMARY

Buildings account for over 40% of global energy use and one-third of global carbon emissions. When combined with the greater built environment—including transportation, materials embodied energy, demolition, and urban planning—the importance of "getting it right" is critical. Whether we are designing buildings, selecting materials, planning for campuses/cities or even advocating for policy change—design professionals can and do have profound impacts on human health, the environment, and climate.

PART A

This session began by examining the current state of our built environment and identified opportunities for achieving best practices in energy, health and sustainability. Building projects—with an emphasis on existing buildings—were reviewed to reveal how designers can uncover profound savings and deep value for both our clients and climate.

PART B

Building on Part A: specific strategies, such as using natural light for daylighting, glare control and artificial lighting controls, which can reduce lighting electrical loads and energy demand in buildings, were reviewed and demonstrated with current technology.


