## Dear People of the Transfiguration!

Yes! This Sunday marks the end of Epiphany as we head into Lent and Ash Wednesday Feb. 10 (wasn't Christmas like yesterday?). There is a lot happening, so fasten your activity seatbelts:

Tomorrow! **Saturday** (**Feb. 6, 3pm**), be sure to come and hear *An Afternoon of Romantic Piano Music* with Russian pianist Andrei Andreev, a masters student at the University of Oregon. Andrei, who was in worship with us two weeks ago, was born in Kok–Jangack, Kyrgyzstan.

This is our **last Sunday before Lent**. It will be the last Sunday to *sing*, *say*, *write*, and *see* the word *Alleluia*. The custom of omitting *alleluia* during Lent goes back at least to the fifth century in the western church; a time to both live without, wait, and anticipate the joy of Easter



when the *alleluias* will return full force. On the first Sunday of Lent, our children will actually lead us in another old custom of *burying the alleluias*. So this Sunday's service will have lots of *farewell alleluias*, including a beautiful piece sung by the women during Holy Communion.

Pastor Adam has a very special (and not-to-miss) children's message (the suspense is killing me!). And since we have just passed the *Feast of St. Brigid* on Feb. 1 (my favorite saint), our hymns and responses will have an Irish bent. I will be making **St. Brigid's bread** for our Holy Communion. This week I also try my hand at baking the gluten-free communion bread.





This last service in our Epiphany series Where Do We Go From Here, is Moving Out from our Comfort Zones, using Luke 5: 1-11 (where Jesus tells the not-catching-any-fish disciples to cast their nets on the other side of the boat). What is the other side of the boat for us? What is there for us in plain sight, but because we've never done it that way, seems totally foreign?

We will begin the habit of sharing **our Sunday prayers** a bit differently. In the bulletin you will see a weekly listing of current joys and

concerns to which the office has been alerted during the week. I encourage these printed prayers for your worship reflection and to be able to take home with you. For immediate prayers there will be a basket in the Lobby for your written prayers, which will be given to the pastors before worship begins.

This Monday evening, our church is one of four sponsors for Rabbi David Zaslow (Ashland), who will conduct a mini-seminar on his book, Jesus: First Century Rabbi. It will be held at Temple Beth Israel at 6:30 pm. The book was recently awarded "Book of the Year" by the church-Synagogue Library Association, and takes a fresh look at the historical Jesus and the Jewish roots of Christianity, which challenges both Jews and Christians to re-examine Jesus' commitment to his





Jewish faith. He will explain how concepts like vicarious

And also **Feb. 10**, also begins our **on-line Lenten discipline** of posting photos that have to do with a certain word each day. As you are out and about and meditating on the day's word, what do you see that conveys that word related to your faith?
