Meet Our Keynote Speaker: **Holly Inglis**

Rev. Dr. Holly J. Inglis is a PC(USA) pastor/educator serving at Palms Presbyterian Church in Jacksonville Beach, Florida, as Associate Pastor for Nurture, beginning in late August, 2015. For the past seven years, Holly has served as Church Educator at Wellshire Presbyterian Church in Denver, Colorado. Prior to Wellshire, she served Presbyterian churches in Indianapolis, Indiana and Arvada, Colorado. Holly has been a member of APCE since 1993 and has led many workshops at annual events and at regional events. Holly's passion has been and continues to be supporting, nurturing, equipping, and advocating for those serving in educational ministry in all capacities. In addition to a Masters of Divinity degree from Earlham School of Religion in Richmond, Indiana, she holds a Doctorate in Educational Ministry degree from Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia, where her research focused on the neuroscience of learning and memory—how neuroscience can inform what we teach and how we teach, in particular how teaching can be more easily remembered. Holly has been a contributing blogger for *Seminarium: the Elements of Great Teaching*, a curriculum writer for Sparkhouse and Vibrant Faith Milestones. In 2014, she authored a book for Fortress Press entitled *Sticky Learning: How Neuroscience Supports Teaching That's Remembered*. She is married to Mark and they have three adult children and a Great Pyrenees, Grizwold.

Don't Check Your Brain at the Door: Creating a Whole-Brain Church

In the last 20 years, neuroscience has literally and figuratively opened up our brains to new understandings and new ways of thinking about how human beings learn. The field of education has begun to appropriate much of this new information in classroom practice and teaching pedagogy. Until recently, the church has not been part of these conversations between neuroscience and educational theory and practice. During our time together, we will reflect on what we do and how we do it in light of recent neuroscience, contemplate what a whole-brain church might look like, and consider the possible impact of those who share ministry with us.
