

Reflections on Spring, the Easter Season and this Presbytery

You will hear more about this at the upcoming June 11 presbytery meeting at Davis & Elkins College!
- --Bluestone As a former camp director, I can testify to the power and potential made alive through church camp. Some of my former campers and counselors (including Barbara Chalfant!) are leaders and pastors in the PC(USA), to which I give God thanks. This is a time to think about signing up for camp! Some of our churches are active in the "Send a kid to camp" movement, raising the funds to send kids from their communities to Bluestone this summer.
- --Hunger ministries So many of our churches either have a food ministry or join in an ecumenical expression in their community to help those with the basics of living, by providing food for individuals and families.

I could go on and on about how we are sharing God's love in this presbytery! "God is Love." Let that resonate within your soul and echo in the cities, towns and hollers of West Virginia!
